I Alexander Danvers of the County of Craven
and State of North Carolina being of a sound
disposing mind knowing the uncertainty of my
earthly existence do make and proclaim the
following my last will and testament,
1st It is my will that my executors hereinafter named
shall provide for my body a decent burial
to suit my friends and relations and pay all
funeral expenses together with all my debts;
I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Susanna
all my property real and personal
and myself, her and my master during his natural
life or widowhood (if living the plantation &
house to live on) And all personal property of
whatever kind and money & value including
my interest in my father's estate for her use
during his natural life or widowhood.
2^d It is my will that my children now single
and again to remain on the farm till their
a house with their mother provided each con-
tribute as far as able to his or her support and
while they remain single and in case any
one of said children should become capable
they shall receive support from the proceeds
of the same and at the death of my be-
loved wife all the property that remains
in hand shall be equally divided to one
amongst my children & their legal repre-
sentative except the bed and bedding
which shall all be equally divided to one
amongst all my daughters after my son
John receives one and also my son John
has received forty five dollars - A sum that
I paid to Eliza Sherrill of his - the other
children receive the said amount of
forty five dollars each of the personal estate
before Henry comes in for any part the
distribution of personal property and again
and lastly I hereby nominate and appoint

my beloved wife Susanna executrix of this
my last will and testament and hereby
making and doing all will and testament
hereupon made.

at the instance when the said testator subscribe his name to the said last
will as witness, said as the time of signing and sealing his name was
within fifteen days to prior to the said Alex. Danvers, son of John
Danvers & memory of his age to execute a will, and was not under any
duress to the knowledge, information or belief of this deponent
and further this deponent say not.
