

Alexander Moore's Will

In the name of God, Amen.

I Alexander Moore of the County of Colquhoun & State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory do this day make public & ordain this my last will and Testament in form and manner following.

1st First, I give unto my beloved wife Anna Moore the use of all my lands and houses and improvements during her natural life together with all my personal property during life then to be disposed of as herein after directed

2^d I give unto my son Capt. R. Moore one half of all my lands ~~xxxx~~ ~~xxxx~~ including the the house and improvements above them

3^d I give unto my son Jacob Moore the other half of my lands and of the shares decedent without any children then his part of the above named lands to belong to Daniel & Morris

4th I give unto my daughter Mary Moore a horse, saddle and bridle also two beds and their usual furniture also two cows and one bureau.

5th I give unto my daughter Eliza H. Moore one horse saddle and bridle, two cows two beds with their usual furniture and one bureau. I also give my two daughters above named their support off of all my lands until they are married. It is my will that all my personal property of every name and nature, with the exception of what is above named, be sold after the death of my wife and the proceeds be equally divided among all my children.

I hereby constitute and ordain my son Capt. R. Moore and my son James Moore my sole executor of this my last will and Testament - and I hereby doth and make null and void all former wills and bequests whatsoever by or unto me.

And the deponent further saith that the said Alex. Moore, the testator, did at the time of subscribing his name, declare the said paper writing to be his last will & Testament, and this deponent did thereupon at the testator's request and in his presence sign his name as an attesting witness. And this deponent further saith that at the time when said testator subscribed his name to the said last will as a witness, and at the time of deponent's subscribing his name, as a witness, as aforesaid, the said Alex. Moore was of sound mind and memory, of full age to execute a will, and was not under any necessity - to the knowledge, information or belief of this deponent.
