I A. A. Brown, being of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament, that is to say:

After all my just debts and funeral expenses are paid I will bequeath and devise all my real estate personal property money and notes which I now own or which may be coming to me from any source or which I may hereafter own to my wife Caroline and my daughter Callie Brown during the life time of my said wife and at her death to my said daughter Callie Brown absolutely in fee simple.

I hereby appoint my said wife Caroline Brown executrix of this my last will and witness my hand and seal this the 4th day of June 1894
