

Record of Andrew Polch Will 1881.

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I Andrew Polch being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of life do this day make and publish this my last will and Testament (herby revoking all former wills) In witness whereof that is to say,
Item First I will and bequeath to my beloved son George Polch my home tract of land where I now live on, about one hundred & forty seven acres except twenty six acres on the north west side embracing the Jones Propst tract which I will hand bequeath to my two daughters Corieba Abrah Polch equally that is thirteen acres each to their use and behoof.

It is my will that my son George Polch is to have the entire home place (except the twenty six acres already willed to my daughters above named) for the support and maintenance of his Father & Mother further he giving out as follows to the heirs of Seneca Hysnoka the sum of Eighty dollars to be equally divided between them and further to the heirs of my daughter Martha M. Miller heirs the sum of Eighty dollars to be equally divided between them and lastly to my daughter Susan M. Propst the sum of Eighty dollars. It is further my will that after my death and my wife's death that my personal property be sold by my Executor hereinafter named and all my debts are paid the residue if any is to be equally divided between all my lawful heirs.

Lastly, I hereby make nominate and appoint my son Henry Polch Executor in my will requesting him to carry the same into effect.
