

Record of Andrew Gilbert's Will 1879.

My will is that my beloved wife Rachel Gilbert is to have at my death on our dear choice not otherwise disposed of on my dear choice, Ten bushels Corn, ten bushels of wheat used all the house hold & kitchen furniture (except the beds I willed to my daughter Mary C. Gilbert) as long as she lives and at her death to be sold & the proceeds divided equally among all my children, and I do hereby appoint my two sons Jacob H. & Phillip V. Gilbert my lawful executors to execute this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name & affixed my seal the 30th day of Oct. 1875.

C. Fleming and the heirs of Austin Camelin, on the Beaver dam Creek & appoint F. Caldwell my executor of this my last will & Testament. This 17th day 1876.
