of my earthly existence do make and declare this

First. I give and bequeath to Clara Whiteman wife of J. Putney
Whiteman all my wearing apparel, one Diamond Pin plated
Brooch, all my Money and Notes that I have Provided
the relatives me and takes care of me in old age and
in sickness.

Second, I hereby Constated and appoint my trusty friend
D.E. Whiteman my lawful Executor to all intents and
purposes, to execute this my last Will and Testament
according to the true intent and meaning of the same
hereby revoking and declaring void all other Wills and
Testaments by me heretofore made.
