The last Will and Testament of Austin Cornelius.  
 I, Austin Cornelius considering the uncertainty of  
 this mortal life and being of sound mind and  
 memory (blessed be Almighty God for the same) do  
 make and publish this my last Will and Testament  
 in manner and form following (that is to say) First  
 I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Ann F. Cornelius  
 the following tract of land beginning at the Ferry on  
 the bank of the river at the mouth of the ditch there  
 west with the ferry road to the Beatty's Ford road thence  
 west to Fleming's line west of the Bearwood creek thence  
 with said Flemings line to mountain creek thence  
 with the meanderings of said creek to the publick Bridge  
 thence with Henry & Henderson Cornelius' line to the  
 river thence with the river to the beginning come  
 to have and to hold during her natural life or widow  
 hood and at the death of my wife the above boundary  
 of land to go to my son Benjamin F. Cornelius to  
 have and to hold forever. My request is that my son  
 Benjamin F. Cornelius live with my wife Ann F.  
 Cornelius and take charge of the farm also whatever amount  
 of household and kitchen furniture and stock and farming  
 tools or provision my wife Ann F. Cornelius and  
 son Benjamin F. Cornelius may think necessary to  
 carry on the farm and support the family.  
 I also will to my three youngest daughter  
 Sarah, Jane and Adel one hundred dollars each  
 to make them equal with those that are married.  
 My will and desire is that all my personal  
 property of every kind that has not been disposed  
 of by will be sold and the proceeds put to the use  
 of paying my debts should there not be a  
 sufficiency to pay any debts the remaining  
 lands not yet settled be rented out until my  
 debts are all payed. Then all my lands not settled  
 to my wife & Benjamin to be equally divided among  
 my children except my son Benjamin. I do make  
 and appoint my wife Ann F. Cornelius & son Benjamin  
 F. Cornelius Executors to this my last Will and Testament  
 in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
 and seal this 20<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of our  
 Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy one
