and declare this my last will and Testa-
ment in manner and form following. That

into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate
Item 1st - give and devise all the wheat corn
oats & barley and all vegetables that is ~~that~~
~~grown outside~~ on hand and what maybe growing on Magdalene Worm
land at the end of my death also one half of
the hogs that maybe on hand, and one half of
all the bacon & lard and half of all the
bees that maybe on hand and one third of all
the cattle that maybe on hand and one third of all
the house hold & kitchen furniture that I pur-
chased since my husband's death that may
be on hand to my beloved daughter Magdalene
Worm.

Item 2nd I give and devise all the wheat corn
oats & barley & vegetables that is on hand that
grew on Linda B. Worm's land & all that
may be growing on her land at the end of
my death also one half hogs & cattle one
third & half of the bees & half of the bacon &
lard & one third of the house hold & kitchen
furniture that I purchased since my husband's
death to my beloved daughter Linda B.
Worm.

Item 3rd I give and devise all the wheat corn
oats that grew on his land and all that maybe
growing on his land at my death also one third
of the cattle and one third of the house hold
and kitchen furniture that I purchased since
the death of my husband & all the farming tools
that I purchased since the death of my husband

to my beloved son Joshua Worm.

Item 4. I give and devise all the wheat corn oats
that grew on her land and all that may be
growing on her land at the end of my death
also all the sheep that may be on hand at my
death to my beloved daughter Rebecca Fulbright.

Item 5. I give and devise all the wheat corn
oats that grew on her land and all that may
be growing on her land at my death also all the
potatoes and vegetables that is growing or that
did grow on her land at my death to my
beloved daughter Adora A. Subbman

Item 6 I give and devise all the money that may
be on hand at my death to be divided equally
between the following named children namely
Magdalene Worm, Linda B. Worm, Joshua Worm
Rebecca Fulbright, + Adora A. Subbman

And lastly I do hereby constitute and ap-
point my beloved Son Joshua F. Worm my
lawful Executor to see intent and purpose to
execute this my last will and testament according
to the true intent and meaning of the same
and every part and clause thereof hereby
reverting and deeming utterly void all other
wills and testaments by me heretofore made in
witness whereof I the said Barbara Worm do
hereunto set my hand and seal

State of North Carolina vs the
Barbera County Superior Court

aforesaid, the said Testatrix was of sound mind and memory, of full age to execute a will, and was not under any restraint to the knowledge, information or belief of this deponent, and further these deponents say not.
