To be lawfully divide among my children & their legal  
representatives except Robert P. Bell, son Philip son of my daughter  
Anna who I have fully authorized to and after the hundred  
dollar is paid which is settled in a former sum shall have  
none of my estate.

I doth appoint and ordain my son in law Eli C. Neal  
my executor to execute this my last will and testament  
to all true intents and meanings revoking and disallowing  
all other wills of me hitherto made. In witness whereof  
I the said Philip Bradwell have hereunto set my hand and  
seal in the presence of the witnesses who have signed hereto  
this 29 day of December 1858

I give and bequeath and dispose of as follows to wit to my beloved  
stepson Franklin Wilson his and bequeath to him the said  
Franklin Wilson all of my estate as aforesaid consisting of  
slaves and personal property &c.

likewise I make constitute and appoint my stepson  
Franklin Wilson to be executor of this my last will and testament  
thus revoking all former wills of me made  
In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and  
affixed my seal this 1st day of October in the year of our Lord  
and fifty eight

In the name of God Amen I Barbra Bline of the County  
of Catawba and State of South Carolina being weak in body  
but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God  
everlasting unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing  
that it is appointed for all men once to die & to make and  
ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally  
and first of all I give and bequeath to the earth to be buried  
in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my friends nothing  
doubting that at the general resurrection I shall receive the same  
by the mighty power of god and as touching such world estate which  
it has pleased god to bless me in this life I give and bequeath of the  
same in the following manner and form first I give and bequeath to  
my son Joseph W. Moore my plantation wherein I now live with its  
improvements out lands adjoining and containing four hundred and  
ten acres I also give to my son Joseph W. Moore a Negro man named  
Adam by paying the rest of my heirs ten dollars apiece to each family  
ten to Babbie Moore ten to John Moreton to Mary Dugay ten to Charles  
Wade ten to Sarah Higginson ten to Anna Wakefield ten to James  
More ten to Sarah & Anna ten to Henrietta Hale ten to Agnes & George  
ten and I will all the rest of my property to be equally divided between  
all my heirs to put to sale and the money equal divided including  
any money or notes if any on hands all to be equally divided  
with all my children that is to say Sarah Connally, Hattie Moore,  
John Moore, Mary Dugay, Deborah Wade, Sarah Higginson and  
Anna Wakefield. James Moore paid a Negro Henrietta Hale eight  
he more agrees to dividing twelve heirs also my will and  
desire is for all that has been given heretofore for to be divided  
equal each to have a good right to their negro and all other property  
that has been given all to stand as equal and no given in  
to my children is all very near to me I love all like them  
may say why not wished to all alike in this will I have two good  
reasons the first is if please god it should live to be old and helpless  
I expect Joseph and his wife to take care of me while I live as he  
lives on the same place and has no other place the second reason  
is he has a crippled hand which pains him even to cut his food with  
I want of you to my Joseph in the best for him now nothing known about  
this will was ope but myself I do hereby whereby declare make and  
disannul all and every other person testament by deed and execution by me  
wife before named took my last will and testament with respect setting  
and confirming this and no other in witness whereof I have hereunto set  
my hand and seal this fourteenth day of October in the year of our Lord  
Eighteen hundred and forty five signed sealed published pronounced &  
of the 15 James Moore as his last will and testament to prove
