 afflicted with various diseases, not expected to
 live long but sound of mind & memory, bend
 before God do make this my last Will and Testament
 hereby revoking all another Wills.
 I^r will my soul to God who gave it to me.
 I^r will that my body shall be buried in a good
 Christian manner the expenses paid out of any
 effects that I may have.
 I^r will that all my just debts be paid.
 I^r will to my daughter Rachael Minerva $\frac{1}{2}$ a
 dollars in money and one third of the wheat also
 One third of my part of the Ground Crop corn
 also one bed slatted one white Counterpoint two
 sheets one bolster and two pillows my Bed my
 Bureau & my chest also four chairs all my Cup-
 board wate my large wash pot all my Cookin
 utensils my water buckets also one of my long
 needles.
 I^r will to my son Felix Grundy McCaul my fallen
 leaf table and bed & bedstead one blanket 2 sheets
 one bolster three pillows one scyph & cradle and
 all my Farming tools also one long kettle.
 I^r will to my daughter Dolly Ann Dellinger
 one dollar.
 I^r will to my daughter Martha Jane Stacy one dollar
 I^r will my two grand Children Charles L.
 McCaul & Minerva L. McCaul one dollar each.
 I^r will all the balance of my effects if any
 should be left to be equally divided between my
 daughter Rachael Minerva & my son Felix Grundy
 McCaul.
 I^r appoint my son Felix Grundy McCaul my
 only executor to carry out the above provision of
 my last will & testament.
