Verdict of Will of Martha J. Bradley
State of North Carolina, in the Superior Court
Catawba County

A paper writing purporting to be the last will and testament of Martha J. Bradley, deceased is exhibited before me the undersigned J.C. for said County, by R. B. White the creator therein mentioned and the one execution thereof by the said Martha Bradley, is proved by the oath and affirmation of James E. Cobb the following witness thence, who being duly sworn, deposes and says, that he is a subscribing witness to the paper writing now shown him, purporting to be the last will and testament of Martha J. Bradley; that the said Martha J. Bradley, in the presence of this deponent, subscribed the same at the end of said paper writing, which was shown as aforesaid and which was dated 27th of March 1856. And the deponent further saith, that the said Martha J. Bradley, the testatrix aforesaid, did at the time of subscribing her name as aforesaid, declare the said paper writing to be her last will and testament and this deponent did thereupon subscribe his name at the end of said will as an assisting witness thence, and at the request and in the presence of the said testatrix. And this deponent further saith that at the said time when the said testatrix subscribed her name to the said last will as aforesaid, and at the time of deponent's subscribing his name as an assisting witness thence as aforesaid, the said Martha J. Bradley was of sound mind & memory, of full age to execute a will and was not under any restraint - to the knowledge or information or belief of this deponent; and further this deponent deposes and says

My will is that my half Sisters Mary Gross, and Jane Hoffman shall have one dollar a piece and all my interest in the lands to my brother Alexander Robinson and all my personal property to said Alexander Robinson, and he shall well and properly take care of my wife Fanny Robinson as long as she lives, and at her death shall provide a suitable burial for her body according to the wish of her friends this is the manner it is to be carried out I do here by constitute and appoint Mr. Cleland Hilderbrand my lawful Executor to carry out this to all intent and purposes. If within mentioned Alexander Robinson does not take proper care of my wife Fanny Robinson this will is null and void. Signed Sealed and Delivered in presence of us
