I Catharine A. Warlick of the county of Catawba and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and ^{memory} but weak in body and calling to mind the uncertainty of life and being desirous of making some disposition of the worldly goods which and altho providence has blessed me do make, ordain and publish this my last will and testament as follows

I will that my executor hereinafter named shall pay first all my debts and funeral expenses and provide for me a marble head stone on my grave out of the first money that shall come into his hands

II I will that my jewelry and silver ware equally divided between my two daughters Mary and Catharine.

III I will that the balance of all my property shall be equally divided between my two daughters Mary and Catharine

IV I will that my sister Barbara shall have the use of my house and lot in the town of Lincolnton in which she lives (and that my estate shall pay the taxes yearly on said lot) during her life.

V I will and hereby appoint my friend Jacob C. Bluff the guardian of my two children and it is my request that Nancy Ransom wife of Hardy Ransom shall raise my two little daughters

VI I will that my daughter Mary shall have my largest watch and my daughter Catharine the smaller gold ^{watch} with my gold chain

VII I hereby appoint my friend Jacob C. Bluff the executor of this my last will and testament revoking all other wills by me. In testimony whereof I have hereunto placed my hand & seal this 23rd day of August 1873
