 Nathaniel Stone of the County of Catawba State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say I wish that my Executor (Thence after named) shall provide for my body a decent Burial suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends, and pay all funeral expenses together with my last debts out of my estate
 And I will and bequeath to my nephew John Stone for his trouble and kind treatment towards me all my estate both in cash & notes & other property which may belong to my estate after my decease, And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint the aforesaid John Stone my lawful Executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I the said Nathaniel Stone do hereunto set my hand and seal this 21st day of February A.D. 1829

In the name of God Amen, it be it remembered that I James Wilson of the County of Catawba and State of North Carolina being sick in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory do hereby considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say
 First that my executor hereafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends, and pay all funeral expenses together with my last debts whatsoever and whatsoever may out of the moneys that may first come into his hands as far as part of my estate, and also my executor hereafter named shall provide for my beloved wife Elizabeth a decent Burial suitable to the wishes of her relations and friends and pay all the funeral expenses out of the moneys that may first come into his hands as a part or part of my estate
 I give and devise to my beloved wife Elizabeth all my land wherever I now live including my mansion house all out houses and other improvements to land and to hold to her the said land and premises for and during her natural life, also two negroes Hannah Brasher also one head Wagon and graining axe
 I give all my stock of cattle on hand or that may be on hand all my stock of hogs, also all my house hold and kitchen furniture all my farming utensils also three head of horses Pull towards me my wife's share is that at the death of my beloved wife Elizabeth that all the above property both real & personal to be sold and the money divided equally between my daughter Eliza C. Powell wife of Smith H. Powell and her three daughters Eliza Elizabeth Mary Lucretia Lavinia to share also George Miller her son the son of Smith H. Powell also provide my said daughter Eliza C. Powell wife of
