I, Cynthia C. Young, with the assent of my husband, P. L. Young, do hereby make and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows, to-wit:

Item 1.

It is my Will that, all my living children to-wit: J. B. Young, J. P. Young and J. C. Young, and Anne C. Young, Mary C. Young, and Anne Thibault, have an equal share in all my estate, real, personal and mixed.

Item 2.

I will that any of my children who have or may have received and advancement shall account for the same in the final settlement of my estate for any and all advancements I have made

as shall hereafter make to them which is to be charged against them in final settlement.

Item 3. I will and bequeath to my sons J. B. Yount, J. P. Yount and H. C. Yount as trustees the sum of three hundred dollars which sum they are to have and hold in trust for the use and benefit of my grandson Harold McHaffey son of my deceased daughter, Katie C. McHaffey (free from the control of his father J. P. McHaffey) until said Harold shall arrive at the age of twenty one years when said three hundred dollars be paid to said Harold without any interest or saved but in case he should die before arriving at that age of twenty one years then the said sum of three hundred dollars shall revert to my estate without any interest or saved and be equally divided among all my children.

Item 4. It is my desire that the said trustees before receiving the above mentioned three hundred dollars shall give bonds for the same in the same manner as guardians.

Lastly. I appoint my three sons J. B. J. P. and H. C. Yount the executors of this my Last Will and Testament.

In testimony whereof I Cynthia A. Yount have this the 25th of April, 1884 signed sealed and executed this Will hereby revoking all former Wills made by me.

I Will and Bequeath to my two unmarried daughters Alice C. and Mary C. Yount are to have all my household and kitchen furniture, beds, bedding, table ware and everything in the house and are not to account for its bequeath I have helped all my other children fully as much as that Will amounts to and direct them Alice and Mary to give to my son Horace one good bedstead bed necessary furniture out this bequest.

I also will to my said daughters Alice & Mary all the grain, provisions and crops on this place on hand at my death.

It is my will and desire that the part of my estate willed to my daughter Annie Wife of L. P. Henkle, be hers only for life and not subject to the control of her husband and at her death to go to her own children without power to sell any of the real estate but she is only to have the use of it for life without power to sell or convey the same.

It is my will that the sum of one hundred dollars be appropriated for the purpose of putting up a tombstone at my grave within three months after my death according to the design and directions I have given my daughters.

Lastly I revoke the appointment of the executors made in the former part of my will all of which is to stand except as herein.
