I Daniel Pinje son of the County of Culpeper and State of North Carolina have made my last will and Testament in writing bearing date 3<sup>d</sup> day of March A.D. 1857 but since that time the situation of my estate is materially altered and so that this my writing which I declare to be a Codicil to my said last will and Testament and to be taken as a part of it and to fully further give to my beloved wife Elizabeth Pinje my negro man Frank which I lately purchased of Henry B. Smith spec. of the last will and Testament of Nathaniel Wilson and which negro I give to her my said wife during her natural life and after her death provided my daughter Frances is living said negro is still to remain in her possession in my plantation when he now is in the purpose of helping her in the raising and tending care of the two orphan children that are bound to me as mentioned in my will come to full age of eighteen years

and after the death of my wife and also after the two orphan children above named to come to the age of eighteen years then said negro Frank, I will to be sold on a reasonable credit if my executor and the money arising from said sale to be divided in the same way as the other money of my estate are directed to be divided by my will I'm witness whereof I the said Daniel Pinje have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 10<sup>th</sup> day of June A.D. 1857

115 In the name of God amen, I Philip Rudinell of the State of South Carolina and of the County of Columbia being sick in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God, but feeling in mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make this my last will and Testament that is to say first of all I give and bequeath my soul into the hands of almighty God who give it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executor nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I will receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as it has pleased almighty God to bless me with some wholly stated I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form,

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth during her natural life one negro girl named Adeline about fifteen years old also one horse best first choice of all my horses, two first choice head of cattle also one year support out of the stock crop & provisions in hand for my said wife and family including my son Philip & Rudinell to be allotted by my executor herein after named also give unto her all of her furniture that she brought her of every kind I also will and bequeath to my said wife during her natural life and my son Philip & Rudinell my plantation I now live on for them to live together and occupy my house as one family & at the death of my wife Elizabeth my said plantation I will once bequeath to be equally divided between my son in law Eli B. Galt and my son Philip & Rudinell to be equally divided to them and their lawful heirs forever I also will & bequeath to my son Philip & Rudinell one negro boy his choice out of my negroes on hand also we have his shoes after his step mother also my negro girl two sets ofearing my said child and have on two best plows also my horse captrader & constant one, harness & black

Then I give and bequeath unto my son in law Eli B. Galt and wife Eliza all the property charged in my account book in his & his wife's

Then I give and bequeath unto my son in law Joel Galt & wife Fanny all the property charged in my account book which is also in their possession

Then I give and bequeath unto Heavens & Rudinell all the property charged in my account book also in their possession

Then I give and bequeath unto Anna Powell's child who is my grand child one hundred dollars to be paid by my executor when I become of age

Then I will and bequeath that my executor hereafter named at my decease sell at Public Sale all the remainder of my property and the proceeds with my money notes and apert of every kind
