Seventh. I hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friend Luther Mosteller my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning thereof in every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.

In witness whereof I the said Daniel Hudson to hereunto set my hand and seal.
