which I gave to my daughter Martha Better but if there is not that much left after my debts are paid and my daughter Melisent gets One hundred dollars I allow whatever is left to be equally divided between my two named daughters viz, Ruth Angel & Hannah. I Rehearse and provided also that if there is any money left after they have each received One hundred dollars then and in the case I allow the balance whatever that may be, to be equally divided and paid over to all my daughters in equal proportion share and share alike to them and each and every of them, their Executors administrators and assigns absolutely for ever and also the debt owing to me when collected I allow to be distributed in the same manner as the money arising from the sale of the goods & Chattels of my Estate

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friend Joshua Wilson my lawful Executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and Testaments by me heretofore made in witness whereof I the said Andrew Wilson do hereunto set my hand and seal this 13th day of June A.D. 1842

Where as I Andrew Wilson have made my last will and Testament in writing bearing date the 13th day of June A.D. 1842

And having thereby made sundry devises and bequests according to the then existing circumstances of my Estate but since that time I have sold my negro man Hittler which negro my executor by my said will was directed to sell, that is I have sold said negro to John Angel for four hundred & fifty dollars, and have taken his note for the payment of the money in the following manner, viz, A note of one hundred dollars due twelve months after date, a note of one hundred dollars due two years after date, a note of one hundred dollars due three years after date and also another of one hundred & fifty dollars due four years after date and have also assigned one of said notes (viz), the one of one hundred dollars due

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Three years after date to my daughter Melisent. Now in order that there may be no Misconstructions of what is the true intent and meaning of my said last will and Testament I do by this my writing which I hereby declare to be a codicil to my said last will and Testament to be taken and construed as part thereof, declare and direct that my daughter Melisent (notwithstanding the assignment of the aforesaid note to her) shall still have the one hundred dollars directed to be paid to her by my said will and that the balance of the note, owing to me in consequence of the date of said negro provided that not collected before my death and if collected what ever money there may be in hand at the time of my death and all other debts owing to me together with all the balance of my Estate shall be disposed of by my Executors as directed in my said will and the intent of which this Codicil is hereby declared to be a part of the foregoing will of I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 1st day of June A.D. 1845

In the name of God amen I David Wilson of the County of Lincoln and State of North Carolina being very sick and weak in body yet of perfect sound mind and memory thanks be given unto God calling to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men here to die do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form as following that is to say First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Barbara One horse and a mare (elt two Cows and grating hiffers) three Sheep one sow with pigs and three Swats about a year old and one cupboard and furniture three beds and bedsteads 2 baths 1 set of linen & fairs 1 Barrow and all her clothing, and four Bushels Irish potatoes all the sweet potatoes 2 Bushels of dried fruit and eight Bushels of Corn stone and peas 2 bottles & 2 Birds 2 pairs hares 2 pair of hares 2 chairs 2 backboards an two belly Bands and meat 2 middling 4 Shoulders 4 9 ammons 1 wash pot 1000 One flying pan 2 small pots 1 still 1 One side Saddle and Bridle 2 axes one Coffee pot One better Charrow and further I will

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do hereby that the balance of my property not called or bequeathed
behold by my Executors next after named, and after my debts
are paid the balance of money is to fall to my beloved wife
Barbara Salts Comblite and attain here I expect Executor of
this my last will and Testament I being conscious to what and make
null and void all and every former will by me made and
published previous and declare this and no other to be my
last will and Testament This 4th day of Feb^r 1842

publish this my last will & Testament in manner and form
following

1st I give and bequeath unto my son John Weaver &

the grain upon hand all that is growing in the fields
all the fowls & live stock of every kind also all the spun
thread & yarn & all the raw materials that can be converted
into clothing all my beds & house hold furniture to them use
and behoof for ever with Beds Chest &c

2^d I give & bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Weaver my loom
harp & all belonging thereto use & behoof for ever with shelf
and kitchen furniture

3^d I give & bequeath unto my son Jacob Weaver part of a tract
of land adjoining John Godds formerly & afterwards I give
to said Jacob that part of said tract on his side of the branch
to his use & behoof

4th I give unto my sons John Weaver and Abraham Weaver all
my land of upst that wither to part in the 5th article of my
will with all the Building also my waggons horses gears & all
farming utensils I will that John & Abraham pay my son
David Weaver out of the land the sum of fifty dollars to
his use & behoof forever 5th I will that if Abraham should not
be able to labor or maintain himself that John do provide for
him & maintain him and have his Abrahams part of the land
for his recompense

6th I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sarah wife of John
Whitman the sum of twelve dollars & fifty cents to her use & behoof
forever to be paid out of my Estate

7th I give & bequeath unto my daughter Salomey wife of
Joseph Fisher the sum of twelve dollars & fifty cents to be paid
out of my Estate to her use & behoof for ever Lastly I appoint
my son John Weaver my Executor of this my last will and Testament
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
righteous day of December one thousand eight hundred and
forty
