I, Sidney Fish, of the County of Catawba and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory, and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life do therefore make, ordain, publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament: That is to say: First after all my lawful debts are paid and discharged, the residue of my estate real and personal, I give, bequeath and dispose of as follows, to my wife the plantation and appurtenances situated thereon lying in the State and County aforesaid joining Washing Springs, C. H. Sherrill, Exa Bridges and others, and all my personal property, notes and accounts and money that may be due to me at my decease. To have and to hold during the term of her natural life or widowhood; and after her death or marriage to be divided equally among my heirs viz: D. D. Josephine, D. J. Doral, M. H. Fidelity, F. F. Audlin, In case that any of the heirs herein named, should die before the death or marriage of my wife the surviving heirs shall share and share alike.
Likewise I make, constitute and appoint J. D. Bridges to be executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made.
