In the Name of God Amen. I Andrew Rinch of the County of Catawba & State of North Carolina being in delicate health and of perfect sound mind & memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence make & publish & declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say Item 1^o I will & bequeath to my beloved wife Emilie my home wherein I now live together with all my personal property for her own use & benefit during her life if she remains unmarried but if she should marry again she is not to have any claim to the said home and other property aforesaid.

It is further my Will that after the death of my said wife Emilie my home together with all my other property money or notes then on hand shall be equally divided among all my lawful heirs to wit my four children now present that is to say my daughter Anna & Maria Jane Rinch, Sylvanus R. Rinch, & James R. Rinch but as it is probable that the family will increase in number hereafter & no provision made in this my will it is my will that if a child or children be born after my decease that the said child or children shall inherit an equal share of my estate with all my other children.

After Party I hereby nominate and appoint my trustee friend J. F. Robinson my lawful executor to set aside & prepare to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same. In witness whereof I the said Andrew Rinch have signed at my hand & seal this 29th day of April A.D. 1866.

204 We Elizabeth Foster & Sarah Foster sisters being in sound mind & disposing memory viewing the certainty of death to all flesh and the uncertainty of life and whereas we have lived together ever since our brother sharing with each other in all our trials difficulties trials and enjoyments and having held our worldly effects profits & labour as tenants in common in mutual love and affection and whereas we are all far advanced in age we are mutually desirous that the temporal blessing we possess shall be enjoyed to the last survivor do hereby make certain publick and declare the following articles to be our mutual will & testament as follows

- 1^o We will & bequeath each unto the others all the property both real & personal cash or cash funds we may die possessed of to have & to hold the same for their own benefit sustenance & comfort to use & employ the same in my manner that may be necessary for their happiness or comfort.
- 2^o It is our mutual will & desire and it is the full intention of this will that at the death of the first or first death that the property herein specified shall remain to the two survivors and at the death of the second member of the family the last survivor own & possess all that may then remain of said property.
- 3^o It is further our will & desire that the survivors pay all the just debts of the deceased and have their mortal remains entombed in a Christianlike manner.

We hereby nominate constitute and appoint our lawful executors to execute this our last will and testament authorizing them to employ such counsel as may be necessary to enable them to carry out & close this foregoing will hereby reciting and disallowing all other wills by us made Signed sealed published & dictated to be our mutual will this 6th day of April A.D. 1866
