In the name of God Amen I George C. Felderman of the County
of Lincoln and State of North Carolina Being weak in Body but
of sound and perfect mind and memory Pysche be God at this
twelfth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand
Eight Hundred and forty two make and establish this my last
will and testement in manner following that is to say I give
and bequeath unto my beloved wife Susanna one chest and one
Bedstead and all her own Bed clothe one Hub and floy
wheel and one cow & two Barrows and one Camphor Bottle and
one small round Bottle one Small Pot and one side saddle which
side after her death is to fall to my daughter Mary I give to my
son Jacob the Smith tools and a small Star Club to my son
Andrew I give his Saddle and Riffle gun and shot gun and one
heifer his horse & two Sheep and which sheep and their increase is
to stay on the plantation so long as my wife lives and the appurtenances
and one white bottle And to my son Valentine I give one heifer &
two Sheep and to my son David I give one mare & cow and Calf
and one hog and one two year old & two Sheep and to my
daughter Mary I give one ^{old} bedstead and furniture one Chest one set
of Cutlery and Silverware one set of Plates and one Cow one sow &
one ~~ewe~~ ^{sheep} one ~~sheep~~ wheel and a bottle
The plantation I now live on Andrew & David is to have all they
can the use of so long as my wife lives and have all they can
make there on for which they are to maintain my wife so long
as she lives and my daughter Mary is to stay on the place and work
as usual and be maintained by prof it and my son Valentine
is to have privilege to live on the place where Jacob formerly lived
and make what he can on the same and if he clear land to have
he makes on it and the Clock & cupboard and all the
shelf furniture & cupboard in the kitchen and all the furniture
and all the pots and other Castings belonging to the place and the
table and stove and two Stoves and hairpins and all the chairs
and all the water pails and washing tub one large jug one
churn one stove for all the Crocks and what broken is on the
place and the half bushels and the waggon and all the horses
growing and all the horses and all the plows and one horse &
stall and all the vessels belonging to it and all the liquor
casks and one grind stone all the last named property is to
stay on the place
and my sons Andrew & David is to have the use of it so long as
my wife lives and after her deceased the land & all the last
named property is to be equally divided among all my children
and all the property such as wheat corn a foddle and oats
hay & floy & also the cotton and wool and bread they that is now

on the place is to go to the use of the place The windmills I give
to my sons Andrew and David each an equal share the wheat
now growing and the meat and land now on hand and what
allowance is on hand is to go to the use of the place And the balance
of the hogs I give to my sons Andrew & David each an equal share
I appoint my sons Valentine and David my lawful executors
In witness whereof I the said George C. Allardman have here unto
set my hand and seal the year and date above written

I John Silzer of the County of Catawba & State of North Carolina being
of sound mind and memory but Considering the uncertainty of my
earthly existence do make and declare this my last will & Testament in
manner & form following that is to say.

First that my executors hereafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relatives and friends & pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts however and to whom so ever owing out of the money that may first come into their hands as a part or parcel of my Estate

Item I give and devise to my beloved wife Mary Setzer the plantation I now live on not otherwise disposed of in my will to have & to hold to her the said Mary Setzer for and during the term of her natural life in satisfaction for and in lieu of her thirds and share of and in all my real estate. Item I give and devise to my son Henry Setzer all that tract of Land wherein he now lives to have & to hold to him and his heirs in fee simple for ever joining Lands of David Wicks and others commencing on David Wicks line at rock at the ford of the branch thence up the lane to the head of the lane thence a N.W course to McHaffey line thence with the old line bound to the beginning to bring a part of the old tract on the west side of said tract to bring the full part of his distinct butler there - I am give and devise to all my daughter that tract of land lying in Indill County on the waters of Rock creek to be equally divided between all my daughter Sally Carpenter excepted her proportion also I have to go to her heirs of said land

Item I give and devise to my two sons George & John Ditzler all that tract of Land on which I now live Except the life Estate of my wife as
