County of Gibralter and State of Carolina being of sound &
perfect mind and memory before he goes to his death
day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and forty and make and publish this my last
Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say
First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife all of her clothes
soo after my death they are to be equally divided between her
three daughters namely Elizabeth Taylor Sally Landis and Emily
Fry and it is also my will that my wife Elizabeth shall live
with my son William during life who shall have a reasonable
subsistence from said son William. I also make give and bequeath
with my son William all that he has received from me hitherto
I also give and bequeath unto my son George all what he has
received from me hitherto
I also will unto my beloved son Daniel Hens all that his father
has received from me hitherto
I also will and bequeath unto my son George all what he
has received from me hitherto
I also give and bequeath unto my son Andrew all what
he has received from me hitherto
I also give and bequeath unto my daughters namely
Elizabeth Taylor Sally Landis and Emily Fry all what they
have received from me hitherto
and I hereby make and ordain my son William Herman
Executor of this my last Will and Testament in witness
Whereof I the said George Herman son have to this my last
Will and Testament set my hand and seal the day and year
just above written signed sealed published and declared
by the said George Herman the last Will and Testament
in the presence of us

In the name of God Amen I Solomon Hull of the County of Carolina
& State of Carolina Sick in body but sound in Mind Memory and
understanding do make and publish this my Will and Testament
in the following manner & form I will my soul into the hands
of God and my body to be buried in a Christian manner
1st & I wish that all my just debts be paid
2d I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy Hull the
Plantation weman I now live during her life time also the old
man & the Master Slave two sets of house bearing with tooling
also the Wood Works of a two horse Waggon now in my Shop and
all the old Irons of a two horse Waggon now broke down and ten
dollars in money to get her with and all the farm cattle six
head of Sheep five head of the following tops now in the pen to brain
also five head of the yearling sheep am breeding. Five & six of the
Lambing pigs all the grain consisting of Wheat Barley & oats & the
Rye & corn and all the Wheat now growing also two Plongks and
the said Harrows am dressed & all the furniture belonging to all
the Buildings such as pots Pots & pans & cans all the Wash Pots Tubs
and Pans and water Pans and all the Charns and Tubs Chest & Trunks
as as many as the Slaves in number all the flat and Shallow & Cloth
all the bags all three five pounds of packed Cotton all the cross Seas
& fine furniture in Room & quilt Work. Wearing has and all that
belongs to the Room all the spinning Wheel and Cards the black two
Wooling has am Mallett all the Utensils I also will and bequeath
unto her an note against Moses Day of fifty three dollars & some cents
with interest thereon

7th I will and bequeath to my son Harris Hull all my tools belonging
to the Shop and all the timber in and about the Shop that is got
out for Waggon there is some few copper tools and copper iron
which is to be sold the wood Works of a light two horse Waggon
to be sold the one half of the proceeds of the sale of this Waggon to
go to Harris Hull the other half to be added to my estate
All the rest of my property not herein specified to be sold and
the proceeds to be equally divided among all my children
I will and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Hull her tools & utensils
After the death of my wife Nancy Hull the plantation & all the other property
that is named in my possession to be sold at public sale & the money thereof
to be equally divided among all my children
And Lastly I do again and appoint Andrew Hens & Benjamin Hens
my Solby and lawful Executors truly & faithfully to execute this my
last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have set my hand
seal this 17 day of Nov 1831
