In the name of God Amen I George Sigman Son of the County
of Calaveras, in the State of South Carolina being of sound &
discreet mind and memory but knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die do make this my last will and Testament
in the manner & form following first I resign my soul into the
hands of God who gives it and my body to the earth from
whence it came to be buried in a decent & Christian like manner
and at Cambridge, the worldly estate whereunto it has pleased God
to bless me with in this life I give & bequeath it in the following
manner, To my beloved wife Mary Magdalena Sigman I
give my good bed & furniture, a good set of Kitchen furniture
to wit a Dutch oven, cork pot flat skillet a deep skillet a good set
of black Irons & forks a set of Tea Coffer & Sauce a half dozen
spoon half dozen fine cups three sitting chairs all of her wearing
apparel a chest and table, her chair, and one large wash tub
a wash tub two buckets, better chosen and three round stand
a half dozen milk pails does she is to have for use of the
dwellings house kitchen stove to burn & Spring house as long as she
lives or so long past as she may wish to occupy does it God to her
during her natural life, my negro girl named Maria about
eighteen years old I also give her one hundred dollar in money
And my daughter Barbara Sigman is to live in the house
with her mother as long as she chooses, or remains single and
my son William Sigman & David Sigman are to furnish her
with a decent support of Natural & Clothing each one of them to
furnish an equal portion, and should they fail to furnish her
such a support then & in that case she shall have the right to
rent out any or all of the lands that I have sold to them from
year to year and appropriate the proceeds thereof to her own
support I give her a fine saddle also one new smothering
Groom. To my son Geo. Sigman I have given a
Tract of land whereon he now lives,

Containing by estimation three hundred two & a half acres, for
which I have executed a deed of conveyance, I have given
him a horse Wagon & Log chairs four or five head of cattle &
other property amounting to one hundred & fifty dollars I also
will & bequeath to my son Geo. Sigman my negro girl named Sophia
about sixteen years old & one hundred & fifty dollars cash
I also give to my daughter Barbara Sigman a tract of land
Containing eighty six acres, joining her Sigman, Williams &
Davis hundred and laid off by John Butler a part of which
is made out of Sigman's land leaving sold with this will I also
give her my negro girl named Mary both named about twelve
years old and after the death of my wife my said daughter Barbara
is to have my negro woman named Sima (the negro I have
given to my wife during her life time) my large dinner and a set
of plates knives & forks and dishes sufficient to furnish a table
a large Dutch oven a small roasting pot flat skillet a pair
a deep skillet two cowbells each a spinning wheel & cards
& two good boxes & furniture & a small table & large wash tub and
she is to have the privilege of living in the house with her mother
as long as she remains single.
To my son William Sigman I give the plantation I now live on
Containing four hundred acres, as laid off by my daughter Geo.
John Butler a part of which he has made out leaving sold with
this will I give him one road Wagon four rough double tree
logs four for four horses two head of horse best, one a dark Shetland
horse named (old price) and a light barrel man two cows &
calves a large smoothish horse a large log chairs I also give
him my negro man named Sam about twenty years old &
a girl named Lucinda about eight years old and he is to keep
the dwelling house & out buildings in good order & well covered &
allow his mother and sister for use of the same as long as his
mother lives and to furnish one half of all necessary for his mother
decent support during her life time, Williams is also to have a good
bed and furniture and a large wash kettle
To my son David Sigman I will & bequeath a tract of land
Containing four hundred acres, lying on the water of Lybe creek
joining Williams lot Barbara George John David Geo. Thos.
David Isaac does other a part of which is made out of John
Butler leaving sold with this will, I also give them my
negro girl named Ephesus about ten years old and a
boy named Martin about six years old I also give him
my old road Wagon & Cart & four for four horses

I doubt see a Wagon Case a large Iron tooth harrow
and a log chain Saw head of horse cast. viz. a gray
And horse and a gray mare & Colt Saw Case & Colles a
Saw Box & furniture, a large Wash Kettle and my
Said Son David is to furnish one half of all necessary
for the support of his Mother during her life time
Lastly the balance of my property & estate after paying my
all my Just debts & the necessary expenses of executing
This will; is to be equally divided amongst all my children
and if they cannot divide it equally it shall be put up
at publick Sale & the proceeds equally divided
I hereby nominate and appoint my son William
Bigman as executor to execute this Will. and I hereby
Publish & declare this to be my last Will & Testament
Reserving dissembling & disallowing all other in former
Wills by me executed

Being aware of the Certainty of death and the uncertainty
of life. I deem it necessary to make provisions for my dear
Catharine. I therefore give and bequeath unto my beloved wife
Catharine during her natural life time or widow hood. all my
Said and household goods also my negro Woman Rach
my old and new Waggons all my Stock of horses cattle hogs &
Sheep also my blacksmith tools. Together with all the crop of every
kind consisting of Wheat & Corn oats hay grass &c. &c. of all
kind farming utensils house hold & kitchen furniture. &c. &c.
I also give & bequeath unto my sons & daughters that is
Elizabeth John Daniel & Polly the sum of Ten Shillings each
this I deem my last will and Testament I further separated
John Daniel Executor of the same in Confirmation whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 30 day of October
