you are hereby commanded to read the will of the  
said Martin Keller and the accompanying premises and  
proceed thereon according to law.

In Testimony whereof I have herewith placed  
my hand and seal this 16<sup>th</sup> day of Oct 1857, at office the  
7<sup>th</sup> Monday after 4<sup>th</sup> Monday in August, 1857, and in  
52<sup>nd</sup> year of our Independance

108 In the name of God Amen, I James Reed of the  
County of Catawba and the State of North Carolina being  
old and afflicted and expecting to soon depart this life, but  
sound in mind blessed be God, do make this my last will  
and Testament.

1<sup>st</sup> I will my soul to God who gave it, hoping for a dayfull  
resurrection at the great day of Judgment.  
2<sup>nd</sup> I will that my body shall be buried in a decent and  
Christian manner. 3<sup>rd</sup> I will and bequeath that all my  
Just debts shall be paid. 4<sup>th</sup> The remainder of my worldly  
Estate, both real and personal I will and bequeath to my  
Law Children named as follows Polly ~~Stewart~~, Martha Robinson  
Elizabeth Bradburn and William H Reed. 5<sup>th</sup> My real  
Estate I allow my executors to sell at private or public sale  
which ever may a majority of the legates may agree and  
my executors to make deeds to the purchasers or purchasers,  
and my whole estate to be equally divided between my  
four children above named including every species of  
property, money or any thing else after all is sold by my  
executors with the exception of my old negro pack  
which I allow to go to any place the horses provided  
they will take her or if she shall become a charge and  
person will not take care of her it in my will that a  
sum of money not exceeding sixty dollars shall be  
retained by my executor for said negro's comfort if  
needed, if she should die and the sum not  
expended that to be paid over to my four children

or their heirs. I appoint Elisha Sherrill my whole executor  
of this my last will and Testament to execute this my last  
will and Testament, revoking all former wills made  
by me and acknowledge this to be my last will in witness  
whereof I have herewith set my hand and seal this 16<sup>th</sup> day

109 In the name of God Amen, I Samuel Abernathy of the  
State of North Carolina and County of Catawba being sound  
in mind and memory and knowing I have well to die  
I now dispose of my worldly estate in the following manner.  
1 I give and bequeath to my wife Nancy Abernathy one third  
of the tract of land I now live on believing to contain about three  
hundred and thirty eight acres her natural life. I also give her  
my wife Nancy one negro man Wesley and one negro woman named  
Felix and one negro boy named Robert Augustus, and one  
negro boy named Leahy, her natural life. I also leave her  
one brown horse one small mare, and five head of cattle,  
her choice and my stock of hags, as many as she needs  
and my stock of sheep as many as she needs also I leave  
her one hundred dollars in money and all my house  
hold and kitchen furniture including wheels Cords Loom  
bustards black with all wooden vessels I also leave her  
my farming utensils of every description haggon gearing  
wood mill ploughs hoes axes her natural life with two  
feather beds and furniture.

2<sup>nd</sup> I give to my daughter Lizer Robinson five hundred  
dollars in money including one hundred and sixty  
dollar she has received. three hundred and forty  
behinds I also leave her one negro woman named  
Elizabeth and her son Alexander and one negro boy named  
Ephraim and one bed and furniture.

3<sup>rd</sup> I leave to my daughter Susa Cornelius wife of John Cornelius  
Ten dollars.

4<sup>th</sup> I leave to my son John S Abernathy the two thirds of my  
land which I have not willed to my wife Nancy and  
her third at her death I also leave my plot of land
