In the name of God Amen!
 I, Henry W. Robinson of the County of Cataraugus
 and state of North Carolina, being of sound mind
 & memory and of body, but being desirous of
 making some disposition of the worldly substance
 with which it has pleased the all-wise Ruler of
 the world to bless me, do hereby declare and publish this
 my Last Will and Testament as follows:

I will and devise to my son John Mc-
 Henry Robinson the tract of land on which
 I now live, including, including the
 ground father M. H. tract, the Sugar tract
 and an entry tract, by said tracts, the
 whole being about 811 acres, viz. Cataraugus
 tract, also 1000 acres of my soil
 on the Daniel Whitman tract of land
 on which my son now lives, containing
 about 107 acres; also, I will to my son
 the Breckin Lane tract of land, containing
 about 300 acres, except the lot that I intend
 to leave to my daughter Opotima Elizabeth Ransom
 and her children, also my daughter Emma
 Coppening children. Also, I will devise to
 my son John McHenry Robinson my saw-mill
 tract containing about 24 acres, also the
 Union tract containing about 270 acres
 joining land of Abram Cook and others.

I will give and devise to my daughter
 Opotima E. Ransom the lot on which she has
 during her life time given after her death, to her
 children, said lot lying in Breckin Lane.

I will give and devise to the children of my
 daughter Emma Coppening, viz. Mr. & Mrs.
 in Breckin Lane.

I will to my daughter Susan Cantlin
 wife of my son Alfred Robinson, all the
 property I may be entitled to belonging to my
 son John. Also, I will

I will also devise to my beloved wife
 Mary W. Robinson, my Union tract and adjoining
 lands except the Whitman ground, during her
 life time. Also, during her lifetime all the

household goods, furniture, provisions and pro-
 perty on hand or due from the plantations,
 or so much thereof (as to the provision) as she
 may desire.

I will also devise the balance of all my
 property, both real and personal, after my
 death shall be sold, my executor herein as-
 signed. And the proceeds thereof shall be
 equally divided between my sons John W.,
 Charles E. Coppening, E. Ransom, and the
 children of my daughter Emma Coppening.
 And I desire that the portion that the
 mother would be entitled to have she living.

I will that my executor shall pay to my
 wife or her heirs the sum of \$1000 as
 the price of my beloved wife Mary W.

I hereby appoint my son John W. Robinson
 the executor of this my Last Will & Testament,
 but if he shall die, all other wills by me hereafter
 made, I appoint him, I have hereunto sub-
 scribed and sealed this 17th day of April 1850.
