First that my executor herein after named, pay my funeral expenses, together with my just debts to whomsoever owing. Second, I will and bequeath to my beloved wife, Susan R. Munday, my home plantation together with all the household and kitchen furniture and pottery and one choice horse, and all my cattle, sheep and hogs to have and to hold during her natural life, and at the death of my beloved wife, Susan R. Munday, the above willed property be equally divided among my children or the heirs of their body. Third, My will is that the remainder of my property be equally divided among my lawful heirs including my daughters Elizabeth L. McAll and Rose Luther Goffen which is to have a share to their children except my daughter Julia Proctor which is to have three hundred dollars less, and my son Monroe two hundred dollars less, and my son Osburn M. Munday to have two hundred less than their equal share and that my son Osburn M. Munday's share be equally divided between himself and his son Luther Munday which is my grand son.
