In the name of God. Amen.

I, James Kever of the County of Catawba, do make and declare this to be my last will and testament as follows:

- 1st I will and bequeath to my beloved wife F. C. Kever for term of her natural life my home plantation whereon I now live containing about one hundred acres as her dower in all my lands. After the death of my wife I will and bequeath to my daughter Mrs. Maggie Gault the remainder or reversion in my home place above willed to my wife provided that if a certain debt of about three hundred dollars and interest be not paid to her before the death of my wife, but if my Executors herein after named shall pay off said debt to my said daughter Mrs. Maggie Gault, in the lifetime of my wife said Maggie Gault is to have no further interest in the remainder or reversion in my home place but is to share equally with my other children as herein after provided.
- 2nd I will and bequeath to my beloved wife F. C. Kever her full years allowance in my personal estate to be laid off and allotted as the law requires in cases of widow.
- 3rd I further will and direct that all my other property both real and personal of all descriptions be sold, after my death, either publicly or privately by my Executors herein after named and that the proceeds be applied to the payment of all my just and honest and lawful debts and the costs of administration and the excess if any be equally divided between all my children, share and share alike. Lastly I appoint my brother David Kever and my son A. J. Kever the executors of this last will and testament.
