To be lawfully divide among my children & their legal  
representatives except Robert P. Bell, son Philip son of my daughter  
Anna who I have fully authorized to and after the hundred  
dollar is paid which is settled in a former sum shall have  
none of my estate.

I doth appoint and ordain my son in law Eli C. Neal  
my executor to execute this my last will and testament  
to all true intents and meanings revoking and disallowing  
all other wills of me hitherto made. In witness whereof  
I the said Philip Bradwill have hereunto set my hand and  
seal in the presence of the witnesses who have signed hunc  
this 29 day of December 1858

thus revoking all former wills of me made

In the name of God Amen I Barbra Bline of the County  
of Catawba and State of South Carolina being weak in body  
but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God  
everlasting unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing  
that it is appointed for all men once to die & to make and  
ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally  
and first of all I give and recommend to the earth to be buried  
in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my friends nothing  
doubting that at the general resurrection I shall receive the same  
by the mighty power of god and as touching such world estate whatever  
it has power god to bless me in this life I give and bequeath of the  
same in the following manner and form first I give and bequeath to  
my son Joseph W. Moore my plantation wherein I now live with its  
improvements out lands adjoining and containing four hundred and  
ten acres I also give to my son Joseph W. Moore a Negro man named  
Adam by paying the rest of my heirs ten dollars apiece to each family  
ten to Babie those ten to John MacLean to Agnes Ogard ten to Charles  
Noble ten to Sarah Biggins ten to Anna Wakefield ten to James  
Moore ten to Sarah & those ten to Henrietta Hale ten to Agnes & James  
ten and I will all the rest of my property to be equally divided between  
all my heirs to put to sale and the money equal divided including  
any money or notes if any on hands all to be equally divided  
with all my children that is to say Sarah Connally, Hattie Moore,  
John Moore, Mary Ogard, Deborah Neal, Sarah Biggins and  
Anna Wakefield. James Moore paid a Negro Henrietta Hale eight  
he Moore agrees to returning twelve slaves also my will and  
desire is for all that has been given hitherto for to be divided  
equal each to have a good right to their negroes and all other property  
that has been given all to stand as equal and no given in  
to my children is all very near to me I love all like them  
may say why not wished to all alike in this will I have two good  
reasons the first is if please god it should live to be old and helpless  
I expect Joseph and his wife to take care of me while I live as he  
lives on the same place and has no other place the second reason  
is he has a crippled hand which pains him even to cut his food with  
I want of you to my Joseph in the best for him now nothing known about  
this will was ope but myself I do hereby whereby declare make and  
disannul all and every other person testament by and execution by in my  
wife before I made took my last will and testament with respect setting  
and confirming this and no other in witness whereof I have hereunto set  
my hand and seal this fourteenth day of October in the year of our Lord  
Eighteen hundred and forty five eighteen hundred and forty five sealed published pronounced &  
as the true and just will and testament to me

die I know that my mortal life will soon be told and my body  
must return to dust from whence it came and I have a well grounded  
hope that my spirit will return to god who gave it and as  
touching my worldly estate when with it pleased god to bless me  
with I give to my deary and much beloved wife above my wife  
I have thought it my duty to make some provisions for her  
support after my departure in the first place I give and bequeath  
unto my wife Liddy the following to wit 1 Dark Log Barn 16x20  
and 10x12 and one Koffer first choice and 14 Head of Hogs  
first choice and six Head of Sheep first choice two Barstangs  
choice and all the House-Hold furniture that my wife Liddy  
brought with her when we were married and all that she had  
while she lived with me including Bed-Clothes and Bed-Steads  
one Loom 2 wheels and 2 bone Cards and all the dresser ware and  
pot ware that she has a claim on two tables and all the chairs  
that she has a claim on and all the pottery on the premises including  
geese and ganders Ducks Geese turkeys and chickens and all the  
work on hands and all the flax on hand and one hundred Dollars  
in Money and all the growing crop of Cotton that is now  
growing on said farm It is this instrument of writing is not  
to interfere with my will Heretofore made by me this is done  
by the consent of myself and my wife Liddy in the presence of us  
this date above under seal his James Moore Seal
