Also I will and bequeath to my nephew John Stone for his trouble  
and time treatment towards me all my estate both in cash  
& notes & other property which may belong to my estate after  
my decease, And Lastly I do hereby nominate and  
appoint the aforesaid John Stone my lawful Executor to all  
deaths and purposes to execute this my last Will and Testament  
in witness whereof I the said Catherine Stone do subscribe  
Set my hand and seal this 31<sup>st</sup> day of February 1831

I give and devise to my beloved wife Elizabeth all my land  
whereon I now live including my mansion house all out houses  
and other improvements to have and to hold for the said land  
and premises for and during her natural life, also two negroes  
Sarah Brasher also one good Wagon and gearing and

Carry all my stock of cattle we have as that may be on  
hands till my stock by hogs, also all my house hold and kitchen  
furniture all my family utensils also their head of horses Cattle horses  
my intention is that at the death of my beloved wife Elizabeth that all  
the above property both real & personal to be sold and the money divided  
equally between my daughter Lydia A. Powell wife of Smith H. Powell  
and her three Daughters Lydia Elizabeth Mary Lucenta Joanna Sophia  
also George Wilson son son of Smith H. Powell  
not provide my said daughter Lydia A. Powell wife of

- Smith H. Paull & should die before my beloved wife Elizabeth  
my will and desire is that my daughters part of my estate shall  
be equally divided between them from Childless Anna Elizabeth May  
and Anna Luina Cathia also George Wilson his son Captain of  
Smith H. Paull.

I give and bequeath to my dear beloved wife Five hundred dollars  
in money two hundred and five hundred to the use of us the two spouses  
I give and bequeath to my three dear daughters Anna Elizabeth  
Anna Luina Cathia one hundred and twenty five thousand  
Dollars each Eliza H. Paull the wife of Smith H. Paull  
Whom they are to have when they come at the age of eighteen  
at the death of my beloved wife  
I give and bequeath to my stepson George Wilson Paull  
One half hundred Dollars which his father has now in possession.  
My will and desire is that all the residue of my estate if any  
after taken out the debts and legacies above mentioned shall  
be left out the debts owing to me collected & if there should be  
any expenses over and above the payment of any debts, expenses  
and spares that such surplus shall be equally divided and paid  
over to my daughter Eliza H. Paull wife of Smith H. Paull  
and my grand children when they come of age Anna  
Elizabeth May Luina Cathia Eliza H. Paull the children of  
Smith H. Paull & Eliza H. Paull wife of the said Smith H. Paull  
And I declare to have constituted and appointed my trusty friend  
William James my lawful attorney to all intents and  
purposes to execute this my last Will and Testament according to  
the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and  
place though his working and retaining, utterly failing all  
other wills and testaments of me myself made
