and State of North Carolina, being now sick, and Confined to bed,
though in perfect mind and Memory, thankes be to almighty God
for the same, having taken into consideration this life being so uncertain
do this the 5th day of March in the year of our Lord 1847. Make and —
publish this my last will and testament, in manner and form as —
follows. First, My body I consign to the earth from whence it came
and as that worldly estate whiche it has pleased God to bestow me
with, I dispose of in the following manner. My Just debts to be first
paid, and the residue of property I Give and bequeath to my beloved
wife Emaline Elizabeth, to her and her children for ever, my further
will is that my executor here after named, Sell at publick or private sale
as much of my property, as will pay my Just debts, as he may think
proper, and as the exoplent of money or property, as the case may be, to be
paid over by my executor, to my beloved wife, to her own use and behoof
for ever and lastly I Constitue and appoint my Brother Henry Whitener
my lawful executer to this my last will and testament, revoking all
others. In witness the said Sife R Whitener has hereunto set his hand and

I Isaac Robinson of the County of Catawba, and State of N.C. the last
being of sound mind and Memory, but Considering the uncertainty
of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last
will and testament, in manner and form following that is to say —
Item first, that my executors herein after named, Shall provide
for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of relations
and friends, and to pay all funeral expences together with my —
Just debts, whatsoever and whomsoever owing, out of the mony that
first, may come into my hands, as apart, or part of my estate
Item I give and devise to my beloved wife Mary Robinson all of
my household and kitchen furniture, So much thereof as she
may want, also, one Cow and Calf, her choice of my wagons
also the plantation wherein I now live, during her natural life
and after her death to go to my beloved son George D Robinson —
also Ten dollars in Money to be paid to my wife by my executor —
So my daughter my wife is that the remaining Balance of my —
Property not settled, be paid by my executor and the amount be equally
Divided amongst my children with the advancement, here before made
that is to Sarah Sife, Fifteen dollars the balance to her and the his
of her bodily forever, Item I make my daughter Rebecca Swain, equal
with the balance of my children with an advancement of
Twenty five dollars previously given, Item I make Mary E Stork equal
with the balance of my children with an advancement of Fifteen
dollars previously made, Item I make my son Isaac Robinson
equal with balance of children with an advancement of Fifty dollars
Item, I make my Son Adison equal with the balance of the same
Item, I make David C Stewar, equal with the balance of my children
And after her death, to go her children, Item, I make Dorcas M.
Stewart, wife of Gaudier Stewart, equal with the balance of my
children with the further sum of Ten dollars, Item, my will is
that my Son George D Robinson have One Sonet Horse, the Horse he
now rides, and lastly I do hereby Constitute and appoint my son George D
Robinson, my lawful Executer, to all intents and purposes, to execute
this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and
meaning of the same, and every fact and clause thereof, hereby
revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments, by
me here before made, In witness whereof I the said Isaac Robinson do
hereunto set my hand and seal this 5th July A.D 1847. Signed and
declared by the said Isaac Robinson to be his last will and testament in —
presence of us who at his request, and in his presence, and in the presence of each
other do subscribe our names as witnesses thereto.
