And also my half interest in lot No. 3 at Catawba Station with its lots & bounds as of record will fully appear known as Bridges & Rosamond Stone House lot to my Grand Sons Shavers, forever also a lot of land I bought of Dr. Bissell in the forks of the Marganton & Lincoln Roads and near the white church to the Shaver boys forever.
