fifty dollars.

To my daughter Nancy Pitts One dollar.

To Pinkney L. Turkeyfill, James L. Turkeyfill each
ten dollars.

To Rhoda James, William James Edwards James and
Thomas James my Grand Children each five
dollars. To William A. Campbell, Perry L. Campbell
John J. P. Campbell & William M. Neal Campbell my
Sons And Grand daughter All the Res of my
estate Real And personal that has not
been heretofore disposed of. And also after the
death of my Son in law John L. Carter & my
daughter Rhoda P. Carter that William A. Campbell, Perry L.
Campbell, John J. P. Campbell my three Sons the
House And Lot lying in Newton wherein the said
John L. Carter And wife Rhoda now live

My Will is that one half and of my real estate be
reserved by my Executors to include the grave
yard for burial of the dead.

Son William A. Campbell to be my Executor
