In the name of God Amen I John Haffner of the County of Catawba and state of North Carolina, being in good health and of perfect mind and desirous more and moreover thanks be to God, but calling to mind the mortality of my body knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion and suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends. And as touching such worldly estate wherewithal it has pleased God to bless me in this life, I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form - and first that my Executors herein upon demand pay all my just debts and funeral expenses however and to whomsoever owing, out any money that may come into his hands as a part of my estate.

Item - I give and bequeath unto Susannah my beloved wife the use of my dwelling house to live in and occupy as she may think proper during her natural life together with my kitchen and other buildings on the land, or plantation whereon I live. I also give unto Susannah my wife, one black servant, her choice of any that may be on hands or I may own at the time of my death, two cows, her choice, your herd of hogs and four sheep, her saddle and bridle, two chests, three tables, and all my kitchen and dyster furniture, two beds and their necessary furniture my loom, a little wheel and big wheel, the grilling wheel, the candle and gear and everything belonging to the loom, nine chairs all the above stated articles I give to my wife during her life, I also give to my wife during her natural life my Negro women Mary Anne.

Item - I give and bequeath to my son Solomon the plantation or tract of land wherons I now live consisting of one hundred and forty three acres more or less provided nevertheless that my son Solomon shall provide his mother that is my wife with all things necessary for a decent maintenance I also give to my son Solomon two head of horses provided I may own that many at my death exclusive of the ones I have given to my wife.

I also give my son Solomon my Kappo and horse gear and all my farming utensils, my still and vessels, rifle gun one half of all the cattle, sheep & hogs that I may own at the time of my death, exclusive of them I have given to any wife; Also one bed and its necessary furniture.

Item - I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Anna two beds and their necessary furniture a chest a table, stool and cards, a wash pot, a cock pot an oven & Spider a Wash tub, a set knives and forks, six cups and saucers, three tables, three crockers a butter plate six tin cups, six chairs, a Copper Pot and bucket, her saddle and bridle and a horse or Thirty dollars in money, as her absolute property forever and also I give to my daughter Mary C. a cow, live sheep and one hog -- I also give to my wife Susannah my clock.

Item I further will and order that the horse that I have killed to my wife at her death is to belong to my son Solomon, and the horses, hounds and children if any, and all other articles of personal property that I have given to my wife shall at her death be sold on reasonable credit and also any other property that may be on hands at the time of my death not otherwise disposed of by this my last will and Testament that is not needed for the use of any wife and family, shall be sold and the proceeds of sale of said property and whatever money may be on hand at the time my death and the debts owing to me collected shall be divided in the following manner (viz) that my two daughters (viz) Elizabeth who intermarried with John Kistler and Mary Loring shall have each the sum of one hundred dollars, provided there be that much money on hands, if not the balance whatever may be lacking shall be paid them out of proceeds of the sale of the property that I have killed to be sold after the death of my wife and the balance or residue of whatever money may be on hands is any wise belonging to my estate after my two daughters have each received the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, shall be equally divided between all my children, or their personal representatives share and share alike as their personal property forever And finally I will and order that my son Solomon and my son-in-law John Kistler do execute this my last will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of every part and clause thereof - hereby revoking all former wills and testaments by me

herefore made and Ratifying and confirming this
and more other to be my last Will and Testament
In witness whereof I the said John Haffner have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 25th to
day of January A.D. 1849

In the name of God I Paul Anthony of the county
of Catawba and state of North Carolina being old and
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die
as I am yet in sound mind and memory blessed be
God for his mercy and think proper to make this my last will
and Testament I do hereby make and publish this my
last Will and Testament in the following manner and
form first I recommend my immortal soul into the
hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body to the
earth to be buried in a decent christian manner and the
expense thereof to be paid out of my estate and that
all my lawful debts shall be paid out of my estate.

First I give unto my beloved wife Magdalene two hundred
and fifty dollars silver coins two & four logs two sheep
to take choice out of my stock I give her Draper
and two beds and steeds with furniture likewise
all the kitchen furniture & cupboard and the spring
house stable for her cows & sheep and the third
of the garden and the right of the Dwelling house
as long as she bears my name as a widow

Second - I give and bequeath unto oldest son Philip
the following property first a plantation called the Run place
two hundred & four acres worth 2300
also another piece joining of three acres worth 36
I also give him two negroes first a boy named Lumpire
about twenty three years old worth 1000

the other a woman named Glory about thirty yrs 300
I give him a horse called Taylor about six years 100
I give him a Cow and Calf 10
I give him a bed & stead worth 8

Third - I give and bequeath unto my second son
Cyrus Paul the following property
1 I first give him two thousand Dollars to pay for his land
2 I give him three negroes first a woman named Nancy
about fifty years old worth 200

3 I give him a boy named Dick about fourteen years old worth 600
4 I give him another boy named Eli about ten years old worth 400
5 I give him a bed worth 12
6 I give him two mules one named Jack the other
named Jo and the gear worth & a bed 15-0
this is the amount when he moved to Georgia
