In the name of God Amen I George L. Helderman of the County  
of Lincoln and State of North Carolina Being weak in Body but  
of sound and perfect mind and memory beseech God at this  
twentieth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand  
Eight Hundred and forty two make and establish this my last  
will and testament in manner following that is to say I give  
and bequeath unto my beloved wife Susanna one chest and one  
Bedstead and all her own Bed clothe one Hub and flog  
wheel and one Cow & two Barrows and one Camphor Bottle and  
one small round Bottle one small Pot and one side saddle which  
side after her death is to fall to my daughter Mary I give to my  
son Jacob the Smith tools and a small Star Club to my son  
Andrew I give his Saddle and Rife gun and shot gun and one  
heifer his horse & two Sheep and which Sheep and their increase is  
to stay on the plantation so long as my wife lives and the appurtenances  
and one white bottle And to my son Valentine I give one heifer &  
two Sheep and to my son David I give one mare & Cow and Calf  
and one hog and one two years old & two Sheep and to my  
daughter Mary I give one bedstead and furniture one chest one set  
of Cups and Saucers & one set of Plates and one Cow one sow &  
one Cow Sheep one wheel and a bottle  
The plantation I now live on Andrew & David is to have all they  
can the use of so long as my wife lives and have all they can  
make there on for which they are to maintain my wife so long  
as she lives and my daughter Mary is to stay on the place and work  
as usual and be maintained off of it and my son Valentine  
is to have privilege to live on the place where Jacob formerly lived  
and make what he can on the same and if he clear land to have  
he makes on it and the Clock & cupboard and all the  
Shelf furniture & cupboard in the kitchen and all its furniture  
and all the pots and other Castings belonging to the place and the  
table and Utensils and two Stoves and hairpins and all the Chen  
and all the water pails and washing tub one large jug one  
Churn one Stove for all the Crocks and what basket is on the  
place and the half bushels and the waggon and all the horses  
growing and all the hogs and all the flocks and one horse &  
stall and all the vessels belonging to it and all the liquor  
cash and one grind stone all the last named property is to  
stay on the place  
and my sons Andrew & David is to have the use of it so long as  
my wife lives and after her deceased the land & all the last  
named property is to be equally divided among all my children  
and all the property such as what corn & fodder and oats  
hay & flog &c also the cotton and wool and bread they that is now

on the place is to go to the use of the place The windmills I give  
to my sons Andrew and David each an equal share the wheat  
now growing and the meat and land now on hand and what  
allowance is on hand is to go to the use of the place And the balance  
of the hogs I give to my sons Andrew & David each an equal share  
I appoint my sons Valentine and David my lawful executors  
In witness whereof I the said George C. Allardman have here unto  
set my hand and seal the year and date above written

I John Silzer of the County of Catawba & State of North Carolina being  
of sound mind and memory but Considering the uncertainty of my

First that my executors hereafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relatives and friends & pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts however and to whom so ever owing out of the money that may first come into their hands as a part or parcel of my Estate

Item I give and devise to my beloved wife Mary Setzer the plantation I  
now live on not otherwise disposed of in my will to have & to hold to her  
the said Mary Setzer for and during the term of her natural life  
in satisfaction for and in lieu of the thirds and dues of and in  
all my real estate. Item I give and devise to my son Henry Setzer all  
that tract of Land wherein he now lives to have & to hold to him and his  
heirs in fee simple for ever joining Lands of David Wicks and others  
commencing on David Wicks line at rock at the ford of the branch thence  
up the lane to the head of the lane thence a N. W course to McHaffey line  
thence with the old line round to the beginning to bring a part of the old  
tract on the west side of said tract it being the full part of his distri-  
bution there - I am give and devise to all my daughters that tract of land  
lying in Indill County on the waters of Rock creek to be equally divided  
between all my daughter Sally Carpenter excepted her proportion also shall  
be as to her heirs of said Land

Item I give and devise to my two sons George & John Ditzler all that tract of Land on which I now live Except the life Estate of my wife as

in all or my item except the part I have given to my son Henry  
before in a former item and all that part of said known as the  
Hannestadt tract and all that part of said known as the Rock tract  
to be equally divided between my two sons George & John & the  
other named land after the death of my wife to be valued by  
three good men and if said men value said land higher than  
one thousand dollars the overplus to be equally divided among all  
my daughters except Sally Carpenter her proportionable share of said  
overplus to go to her heirs  
Then I give and bequeath to my said beloved wife all the crop stock  
and provision now on hand together with the mill stills and vessels  
wagon household and kitchen furniture and farming utensils it is  
left in my will that my said wife after my death pay all necessary  
charges and debts it is further my will that my said wife have the  
negro woman named Lucy and a negro boy named Eliza and a  
boy named Joshua to have and to hold during his natural life all  
the above named property after the death of my wife it is my will  
that my kinmen after named Executor shall sell said property and the money  
rising from said property to be equally divided between all my  
daughters Sally Carpenter excepted her proportionable share of said  
property to go to said Sally heirs it is further my will that my wife  
be to furnish my four youngest daughters equal with those that are  
married or in case my wife should die my will is that my Executor  
furnish them out of the proceeds of said property to the amount of  
forty dollars each and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint  
my two sons Henry Carpenter and George Carpenter my lawful Executor  
to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will & Testament  
according to the true intent & meaning of the same every part and  
clause thereof hereby writing and declaring utterly void  
all other wills and testaments by me hereunto made  
in witness whereof I the said John Carpenter do here unto set my hand and  
seal this 30<sup>th</sup> September AD 1844
