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# Will of John Ward 1879

I know all men by these presents  
 & John Ward of the County of Catawba & state of  
 North Carolina being in good health & of sound  
 & perfect mind & of good understanding knowing that  
 it is appointed once for all men to die I do therefore make  
 this my last will & testament revoking all others I will  
 unto my son J. S. Ward & Catharine Rockسانیه Berry all  
 the land I own of which I now live one hundred & twenty-  
 five acres by the same more or less one hundred & forty acres  
 joining the home tract then four acres of the Harry Link tract  
 joining the same twenty six acres known as the John Holler land  
 joining the Harry Robinson tract to be divided equal between J. S.  
 Ward & C. R. Berry except that J. S. Ward shall have all the build-  
 ings where I now live & the buildings not to be valued by no  
 consideration I will that C. R. Berry shall have possession of  
 their lands her lifetime & if she dies without Bodily heirs this  
 land now named for her above shall come back to my heirs  
 I will that if C. R. Berry's land should fall back to my heirs  
 that C. R. Berry's land <sup>suppose all my heirs to be this intent</sup> to be sold to J. S. Ward I will to my  
 daughter Rhody L Hawn & her children the tract of land where  
 she now lives joining wife Miller known as the Elisha Holler land  
 seventy-six acres thirty-six acres joining where she now lives seventy  
 acres joining John Holler & the Row land the north part of the Rob-  
 inson tract the line to run east & west I will to my son A. P. Ward &  
 my daughter Sarah E. Yoder all that tract of land known as  
 Lawson Seitz Land joining Sally Hawn & Peggy Hawn & others two hun-  
 dred & twenty acres to be divided equal between A. P. Ward &  
 Sarah E. Yoder I will that A. P. Ward shall hold the land  
 where he now lives & all the buildings <sup>not</sup> Jones Hards house barn  
 & crib I will that A. P. Ward buildings not to be valued Sarah  
 E. Yoder shall pay to Jones Hards heirs what the house is worth  
 I will A. P. Ward the tract of land known as Daniel Hawn bottom  
 joining Sally Hawn & Peggy Hawn fourteen acres A. P. Ward shall  
 pay five hundred dollars for the fourteen acres of bottom & to  
 be distributed this money amongst the heirs to make them equal  
 I will to S. Angelina Seitz heirs Pinkney Seitz Franklin Seitz  
 David Seitz Candace Seitz Belle Seitz I will seven hundred  
 dollars in money equal between S. A. Seitz heirs named above  
 I will unto my son Jones W. Ward heirs Laura Ward Charly  
 Ward Alie Ward Seven hundred dollars in money to be di-  
 vided equal between Charly Ward Laura Ward & the Ward  
 I will to Sarah E. Yoder C. R. Berry R. C. Hawn S. E. Seitz heirs

Candace Seitz & Belle Seitz all my bedding & clothing equal  
 between the said girls I will that all my lands shall  
 be divided amongst yourselves as it is now here laid down  
 & after it is divided if there is any difference in the ap-  
 praisal to pay to each other to make you all equal & to choose  
 amongst yourselves three good disinterested men to ap-  
 praise the lands I will if the money does not reach to make  
 the heirs equal that of J. W. Ward's heirs & Angelina Seitz  
 heirs the heirs that gets the land shall pay over to make  
 them equal I will the bedding & bed clothing that Can-  
 dace Seitz & Belle Seitz gets to be valued & to be counted  
 out of their part of money I will if I should die before  
 my wife I want her to make choice of all my personal  
 property & the balance put to sale I want my wife  
 to hold possession of the lands as long as she would live  
 I will that this will shall not go into effect until after  
 the death of my wife.

I do hereby make & ordain my esteemed neighbors A. P.  
 Ward J. S. Ward & Moses Yoder executors of this my last Will &  
 Testament in witness whereof I John Ward the testator have  
 to this my will written on one sheet of paper set my hand &

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## Record of Frederick Killian's Will 1879-

I, Frederick Killian of Leetwoka County, do hereby make publish  
and declare, this as my last Will and Testament in  
words and figures, as follows to wit:

Item First, My executor hereinafter named is to pay all  
my just debts out of any money or property on hand  
at my death.

Item Second, I will and bequeath to my son Samuel  
E. Killian, fifty acres of land including the dwelling  
and out houses where I formerly lived for which land,  
I have conveyed to him by deed of gift valued at  
four hundred dollars, which I consider his  
fair share in my land.

I have also sold unto my son Samuel E. Killian,  
all my other land for which he has paid me  
several hundred dollars in cash and given  
me a bond for my support for the remainder  
of my life, and has received a deed of  
conveyance for said land.

Item Third, I give and devise to my three daughters  
Lydia Pitt, Derrick wife of James Brown, Nancy  
Holler and Mary wife of Luther Thineulent each the  
sum of one hundred and seventy five dollars,  
which has also been paid to them out the  
money paid to me by my son Samuel for the  
aforesaid land, which I consider their fair  
share in all my land.

Item fourth, After my executor hereinafter named,  
shall have paid all my debts, out of the money  
and notes on hand at my death, he shall divide  
all the remainder equally between my four  
daughters and my son Samuel's share and  
share alike and in case any of said  
children die before me, then the share  
of such child is to go to his or her  
children if any.

Lasty I hereby appoint my son Samuel  
E. Killian the executor of this my last  
will and Testament. Frederick Killian  
Witnessed by us in the presence of each other,  
and in the presence and at the request of the  
testator this 18<sup>th</sup> of Dec 1875.
