In the name of God am I, Henry Linn of the County of Catawba and State of North Carolina, being in good health and of perfect mind and disposing mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do this 8th day of April A.D. 1867 make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following, and first that my Executor herein after named, provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends, and pay funeral expenses together with my just debts however and to whomsoever owing.

Item, I give and bequeath to John H. Bandy and his wife Harriet, who is my niece, all my undivided interest being one third part of a tract of land containing two hundred acres more or less, & second tract, which land was originally granted to John Linn Deced by a States Patent bearing date the 17th day of December A.D. 1801, and was allotted to me and two of my sisters Mary, Annelie and Sarah by said John Linn Deced, to the said John H. Bandy and Harriet his wife their heirs to their right and property in fee simple absolute forever.

Item I give and devise to the said John H. Bandy and Harriet his wife all the personal money, or lands, that have accrued to a son of the heirs of the aforesaid John Linn Deced, by that may be drawn, or received, for or in consequence of the revolutionary services of my father the aforesaid John Linn Deced, and also to give to the said John H. Bandy and Harriet his wife my interest being one half of a log house, one cowe all my house hold and kitchen furniture and in a word to give and bequeath to the said John H. Bandy and his wife Harriet all other of my Chatte or personal property and money, or debts that are owing me, or obligations for money that are now here, or may have at the time of my death, as their right and absolute property forever.

I do finally will and order that my trustee friend the aforesaid John H. Bandy do execute this my last will and testament hereby making all former wills and testaments by me heretofore made and publishing this and none other to be my last will and testament. In testimony whereof the said Mary Linn have countersigned my hand and affixed my seal the day and date just above written signed sealed published and delivered by the said Mary Linn

In Joseph Carpenter of the County of Catawba and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence to make and declare this my last will and testament in form following. That is to say, first that my Executor herein after mentioned pay all my just debts however and to whomsoever owing out of any money that may come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

Item, I give and bequeath to Elizabeth my wife the use of all my buildings that are on the plantation or tract of land whereon I now live together with as much of the land as she may think proper to occupy, as long as she lives. And also all my personal property during her natural life, and at her death, to go to my son Daniel H. Carpenter as he liveth after mentioned.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Daniel H. Carpenter the plantation or tract of land whereon I now live, containing one hundred and sixteen acres more or less, except the life estate of my wife as aforesaid in a former clause of this my last will to have and to hold to him, and his heirs in fee simple forever. My will and desire also is that my son Daniel H. Carpenter shall have the full privilege of living in in my dwelling house with his Mother, or if she should die think proper to build a house on some suitable part of the plantation, and occupy whatever part thereof his mother may not wish to occupy, and as before stated at the death of my wife Elizabeth my will and desire is that my son Daniel H. Carpenter shall have all my real est. Under such trust and condition as hereinafter constitute and appoint my son Daniel H. Carpenter my lawful Executor to execute this my last will and testament hereby making and declaring unto his son Daniel H. Carpenter and testaments hereunto made.
