In the Name of God, Amen

I Joseph Fulbright being of sound mind & memory and knowing the uncertainty of life and certainty of death I hereby ordain constitute and make this my last will and Testament in way and manner as follows.

1st. I will that at my decease my body be decently buried and that my funeral expenses be paid out of the first money that comes into the hands of my executor hereinbefore named.

Secondly - I will and bequeath to my wife Anna Fulbright all my Real Estate consisting of two tracts of Land, The first tract I now live on containing about twenty five acres more or less adjoining lands of T. B. Little, New. Blinn & others The second tract known as the Carpenter land adjoining lands of C. H. Fulbright & others with all & every the upper-
tawees therunto belonging to have and to hold both tracts as described and shall have the full Right and power to convey the same to whom she will. Thirdly - I also will and bequeath to my wife Anna Fulbright all my personal property of which I may be possessed of at my decease Lastly - I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Anna Fulbright my lawful executrix to execute this my last will and Testament in witness whereinto I set my hand and seal this the second day of September 1882
