last will

In the Name of God, Amen
I Joseph Fulbright being of sound mind &
memory and knowing the uncertainty of life
and eternity of death I hereby ordain constitute
and make this my last will and Testament
in way and manner as follows.

1st. I will that at my decease my body be
decently buried and that my funeral expenses
be paid out of the first money that comes into
the hands of my executor hereinafter named
Secondly - I will and bequeath to my wife
Anna Fulbright all my Real Estate consisting
of two tracts of Land, The first tract I now
live on containing about twenty five Acres
more or less adjoining lands of J. B. Little, New
Helm & others the second tract known as the
Carpenter land adjoining lands of E. & H.
Fulbright, & others with all & every the Appur-
tenances thereto belonging to have and to
hold both Tracts as described and shall have
the full Right and power to convey the same
to whom she will. Thirdly - I also will
and bequeath to my wife Anna Fulbright
all my personal property of which I may be
possessed of at my decease Lastly - I hereby
constitute and appoint my wife Anna
Fulbright my lawful executrix to execute
this my last will and Testament in
witness whereunto I set my hand and seal
this the second day of September 1882.

writing so subscribed by him, and exhibited
to be his last will and Testament, and this
deponent did thereupon subscribe his name
at the end of said will, as an attesting
witness thereto, and at the request, and in the
presence of the said Testator. And this deponent
further saith, that at the said time when the
said Testator subscribed his name to the said
last will as aforesaid, and at the time of the
deponent's subscribing his name as an attesting
witness thereto, as aforesaid, the said Testator
was of sound mind and memory, of full
age to execute a will, and was not under any
restraint to the knowledge, information or
belief of this deponent, and further these
deponents say not.
