I will and bequeath to Mary Shock two beds provided they are here, all the rest of my household and kitchen furniture to be equally divided between G. P. Coffey and the said Mary Shock.

As to all the rest, residue and remainder of my personal estate, goods and chattels of whatever kind and nature, I will to G. P. Coffey and his heirs and assigns for ever.

I hereby appoint George F. Bradley Executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made.

Last Will & Testament of Henry Hawn.

North Carolina (Catawba County) I Henry Hawn of Hickory
in the County and State aforesaid do make and constitute
this my last Will & Testament, revoking and setting
aside all previous wills. I give and bequeath to my
son David T. Hawn the sum of two hundred dollars
and one half of the loose bedding. These bequests
to be paid to my said son at and after the
death of my wife Catharine Hawn, unless
she may choose to pay them sooner. I give and
bequeath to my said beloved wife Anna T. Hawn
the use and benefit of all my property of every
description Real and personal during her lifetime
and I hereby authorize and empower my Executors
herein named to sell and convey any of the property
of which I may be possessed at my death under
her my said wife's direction, and convey the
same to the purchaser.

After the death of my wife I will that my
remaining property after paying the above
bequests be equally divided, with David T. Hawn
(Caroline) Whitener and the heirs of my deceased daughter
Catharine Voder, that is that the estate be divided
into three equal parts, that David T. have one share,
Caroline, one share, and the Children of Catharine
one amongst them.

It is my wish and desire that my wife have a
good and comfortable living out of the estate
during her life time, and I so will and
direct. I hereby constitute and appoint Pink
Whitener and David E. Whitener Executors of this
my will. I also will and direct that my
Executors above named have prepared and erected at
my own grave, and also that of my wife after
our death suitable Tomb Stones which shall be
paid for together with our funeral expenses before
the division of the estate as directed before is
made Witness my hand and seal this 30th
day of July 1870.
