

Last Will and Testament of Macon H. Shuford

I, Macon H. Shuford of aforesaid County State, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last Will and testament:

First, My executor, hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives and friends and pay all my funeral expenses together with all my just debts, out of the first money which may come into his hands belonging to my estate.

Second, I give and bequeath to my beloved sister Eva May one half of my real estate on which I live.

Third, I give and bequeath to my beloved sister, Mattie Ann one half of said real estate.

Fourth, I give and bequeath to my brother Laban \$2.00 and to my other two sisters Louella and Laura \$2.00 each. My desire is for my executor to sell at auction to the highest bidder all my chattel property, giving 6 or 12 months time with good security.

Fifth, I hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friend Sidney L. Lefevre my lawful executor to all intent and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and Clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
