I Marcus Goden of the County of Catawba and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last Will & Testament in Manner and form following that is to say:
First That my Executrix (hereinafter named) shall provide for my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts, howsoever and to whomsoever owing out of the monies that may first come into her hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

Item; My will and desire is that my executrix shall provide a neat Marble Head Slab and have it placed at my resting place to mark my Grave to be paid for out of the proceeds of my estate.

Item; I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Martha C. Goden all my estate both real & personal, notes, money, and effects of what ever kind that may be on hand at my death provided she keeps my name during the balance of her natural life but in case she should marry again then in that case she is entitled to one third of all my estate as mentioned in this item as hers to use & Control as seems best for her.

Item my will and desire is that if my wife Martha C. Goden remains a widow during the remainder of her life that after her death that all the debts that may then be due and unpaid shall be paid out of the estate together with all her funeral expenses including the marble slab to mark her resting place also the same as mine.

Item I will and bequeath (after the death of my wife Martha C. Goden) seven hundred dollars to build in building a brick Church at Zion Church in Catawba County provided the Congregation there of the C. Lutheran Church will raise a sufficient amount together with this bequest to erect said Church building.

My father will and desire is that all the balance of my estate (after the death of my wife) shall be

placed in the hands of the Church Council of
the E. Lutheran Churches at Zion & Hickory
which (the latter) I am a member at this time
& by them loaned or invested in bonds of the
U. S. or to private individuals on good mortgages
or invested in some way so as to be perfectly
safe that the interest may be paid annually and
of said interest I desire that in case the
congregations of the E. Lutheran Churches at
Zion & Hickory believe and have the pure doctrine
taught & preached, as taught in the old and
New Testament and the Symbolical books and
especially the book of Concord then of said
interest I desire that if the congregations in
said churches have preaching once a month
in each church that fifty dollars of said
interest shall be paid yearly for the sup-
port of the Minister in each church, but if
the preaching be twice a month then the amount
shall be one hundred dollars to the support of the
Minister of each of the said churches per annum
provided the interest of the fund so set aside
be sufficient to pay said two amounts and if
not the amount of interest on hand shall be
divided between the said two congregations ac-
cording to the foregoing arrangements. And further
-vised further that if the interest of the fund on hand
should be amount to more than the sums here
mentioned for said two churches then if the
Minister will locate or live in the bounds
of said congregations so that he can visit
the sick, Minister to the dining & see that the wants
of his flock are properly fed then the interest as
above said if it amounts to more shall be
divided between said two congregations as
stated after paying the expenses of keeping the
said funds in a safe investment.
My desire further is that so long as these two
congregations will do their duty in supporting the
Minister this fund shall be perpetual, but in case
they fail to do their duty in supporting the Minister
then this fund ceases and will be withheld

Item: My will and desire is that if my wife inter-
-married again then & in that case two thirds
of all my estate is to be applied to the two
churches as stated above in the same ratio
as is already stated leaving the other one
third to my ^{my} wife absolutely.
Item: My will & desire is that after my death
I desire my friends & relatives to carry my body
to Zion Church Yard & deposit my body
beside my father and Mother.
And lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my
beloved wife Martha C. Foder my lawful
Executrix to all intents & purposes to execute
this my last will & testament according to
the true intent & meaning of the same & every
part & clause thereof hereby revoking & declaring
utterly void all other wills & testaments by me
heretofore made.

set my hand & seal this 3rd day of April 1880.
