widow of Martin Trenhou do being of sound  
mind and memory do this the 14<sup>th</sup> day of  
Sept in the Year of our Lord eighteen hundred  
and seventy four Make this my last Will and  
Testament in manner and form whereafter named  
1<sup>st</sup> It is my Will to give my body to be buried in a  
decent manner by my hereafter named executor  
and I give my Soul to God who gave it.  
Such as to my earthly concerns it is my Will  
that my funeral expenses & head stones be paid  
out of my estate  
3 It is my Will that David Trenhou, shall have the  
remainder of my estate for the reason that I am  
living with said Trenhou and expect stay with  
said David Trenhou during my natural life-  
time  
4<sup>th</sup> It is my Will that David Trenhou, be appointed  
my executor of this my last Will and Testament  
and that he may have power to sell or to keep  
the said property without making sale and  
be the full owner of said property after  
my departure.  
5<sup>th</sup> I hereby revoke all will and claims if any  
to the said property, am set it apart (leave)

and assigns forever.
