As far as my earthly concerns it is my will that my funeral expenses & head stones be paid out of my estate.

It is my will that David Greenhour shall have the remainder of my estate for the reason that I am living with said Greenhour and expect stay with said David Greenhour during my natural life-time.

It is my will that David Greenhour be appointed my Executor of this my last Will and Testament and that he may have power to sell or to keep the said property without making sale and be the full owner of said property after my departure.

I hereby revoke all will and claims if any to the said property am set it apart the said David Greenhour and his heirs and assigns forever.
