

October Second 1847.

In the name of God, Amen. I Henry Whittemore of the County of Catawba and State of North Carolina, being sick in body, but of perfect mind and memory, knowing that it is apperent for man to die and wishing to dispose of my worldly affirs to make this my last will and testament in the following manner and form, viz., 1<sup>st</sup>. I recommend my soul to Almighty God, who gave it and my body I desire to have buried in a decent Christian like manner. 2<sup>nd</sup>. I will and bequeath the sole property and belied wife Margaret and Negro woman named Simona to help sustinian her and the children that may stay with her as long as she liveth, and also to have the use and tillage of as much of my land as she may need to tend and all the house hold and kitchen furniture, as long as she liveth, and the privilege of the house as long as she liveth. It is my will and desire that as much of my stock of me thins as my wife may need to remain on the premises as long as she liveth. 3<sup>rd</sup>. I will and bequeath unto four of my sons Thomas, Saml. Henry, David and Lawrence, all my lands, and the fine tract Seining, Davis River and those to be equally divided among them, in proportion and what so ever are left the John Whittemore tract, & the David and bequeath unto my daughter Mary one Negroe girl named Simona, etc. I will and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret with one Negroe girl named Nancy. I will and bequeath unto my daughter Eliza & a little Negroe girl named Caroline. I will and bequeath unto my daughter Agnes to one Negroe girl named Martha. I also will that my son Saml. pay each heir ten dollars a piece out of his part. I will that my fine tract of land be sold and add the balance of my property that is not named in the above will, be sold, and all my last debt be paid out of it and the over plus if any, to be equally divided among my children. I do hereby pronounced this to be my last will and Testament, and do hereunto affix my hand and seal this the 18<sup>th</sup> day of August A.D. 1847.

In the name of God, Amen. Whereas it is apperent for all men to die, but the time uncertain, and I now being in perfect mind and memory, I make and ordain this my last will and testament. First and foremost I resign my soul into the hands of god, who gave it, and my body to the earth from whence it was taken, and as to my little earthly estate wherewithal it shall be, and God to bless me with, I bequeath in the following viz - First, I bequeath to my beloved wife, Betty all my property, both Chatt and Movable, to occupy and manage as she may think fit, and most beneficial to her self, and chilidrability during her natural life, and after her death, all both land other property to be sold at public sale, and as some of the children have not received any thing and may not during my life or their mothers, they are entitled to receive as much as will be to the amount of what the others have recived, and then what remains to be equally divided between all my children viz - John Henry, Godrichia, Elkanah, Esteb. Rhodah, Ruth Anna and Elizabeth, and in case any of them my children should die before the time of this little testation leaving any heir or heirs, such heir or heirs to be in debt to the property part and I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Betty and my son John Coulter to be the Executors of this my last will and Testament, and guardians of my grand children, this written with my own hand and signed this 25<sup>th</sup> day of May 1847.

I do hereby publish and declare this to be a part of my last will and Testament drawn under my hand the 25<sup>th</sup> day of February A.D. 1848.
