## WILL OF WHEELER M. KEEVER.

North Carolina, - - - Catawba County.

I, Wheeler M. Keever, of the aforesaid County and State being of sound mind but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last Will and Testament.

First. My Executrix hereinafter named, shall give to my body a decent burial and pay all funeral expenses, together with all my just debts, out of the first moneys coming into her hands belonging to my estate.

Second. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Susan V. Keever, all my household and kitchen furniture of whatsoever kind, also all my tools (Shoemakers) together with any and all other personal property that I may have at the time of my death, including all moneys, notes or other property of whatsoever kind: That is to say that I give and bequeath to her all of my personal property of whatsoever kind or description that I may have at the time of my death.

Third. I give and bequeath to my said wife and all amount of insurance that I now have or may hereafter have, together with the amount that will become due and payable at my death under Benefit Certificate No. 85533 issued to me by the National Union while a member of Hickory Council, No. 864. It is my Will that in the event my said wife shall not but live me, then the amount due on said Benefit Certificate shall be paid to Fannie R. Linebarger, the daughter of my said wife.

Fourth. I will and devise any and all real estate that I may have at the time of my death to my said wife Susan V. Keever, and in the event my said wife shall die before I do, then said property shall go to said Fannie R. Linebarger.

I hereby constitute and appoint my wife, the said Susan V. Keever, my true and lawful Executrix, to execute this my last Will and Testament, according to the true intent and meaning of same, and every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other Wills and Testaments heretofore made by me.
