In the name of God. Amen.

I, Mary M Robinson wife of Henry M Robinson being of sound mind and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of life and being desirous of making some disposition of the worldly substance with which it has pleased Our Allwise Providence to bless me with, do make, Ordain and Publish this as my last Will and Testament as follows:

First, I will and devise to my son John Wilfong Robinson my tract of land known as the City tract of land joining lands of David George & others, also my Miller tract of land joining lands of the said David George tract and others, also my main fair lands known as the Dappough Bottoms lying in Caldwell County on Milver's Creek.

The balance of my lands including the Concordance tract, the Vaughan lands near Hickory Station, I devise to my daughter Cynthia E. Romsdane during her life time and after her death to her children and to my daughter Elmina Corpesing children the children of my said daughter Elmina to have the share of their mother said lands to be divided in two parts between my said daughter Cynthia E. and her children and the children of my said daughter Elmina Corpesing as aforesaid.

I hereby Appoint my son John Wilfong Robinson the Executor of this my last Will and Testament.

And the deponent further deposes, that the said Mary M Robinson, the testatrix aforesaid, did at the time of subscribing her name, as aforesaid, declare the said paper writing so subscribed by her and exhibited, to be her last will and Testament and this deponent, did thereupon subscribe his name at the end of said will as an attesting witness thereto, and at request and in the presence of the said testatrix. And this deponent further deposes, that at the said time when the said testatrix subscribed her name to the said last will as aforesaid, and at the time of the deponent's subscribing his name as an attesting witness thereto, as aforesaid, the said Mary M Robinson was of sound mind and memory, of full age to exercise a will, and was not under any restraint to the frank disclosure of information to belief of this deponent; and further these deponents say not: A M Seethamper (Said)
