State of North Carolina, Catawba County. December the 15<sup>th</sup> 1868  
I, A. Robinson, Executor of Mary Sapoche of the County of Catawba and state of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and Testament in manner and form as follows:-

That my Executor (herein after named) shall pay all my just and lawful debts howsoever and whosoever owing out of the first money that may come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

And lastly I do hereby appoint my trusty friend and neighbor A. Robinson my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and Testament according to the true meaning of the same and every part, clause, thereof, hereby revoking all other Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made.
