Four Person 1845

In the name of God Amen I Conrad Weare of the State  
North & County of Lancaster being weak in body yet of a  
sound and perfect disposing mind & memory do make &  
publish this my last will & Testament in manner aforesaid  
following

1<sup>st</sup> I give and bequeath unto my son John Weare &  
Absalom Weare and my daughter Elizabeth Weare all  
the grain upon land all that is growing in the fields  
all the fodder & by stock of every kind also all the Spun  
Thread & yarn & all the raw materials that can be converted  
into Clothing all my beds & house hold Furniture to them as  
and behove for use with Beds-Chest &c

2<sup>d</sup> I give & bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Weare my Room  
chairs & all belonging thereto & behove for use with Chests  
and Kitchen Furniture

3<sup>rd</sup> I give & bequeath unto my son Jacob Weare part of a tract  
of Land adjoining John Yoder formerly & at the time of his death  
to said friend that part of said tract on his side of the branch  
to his use & behove

4<sup>th</sup> I give unto my sons John Weare and Absalom Weare all  
my land of as yet that will be found in the 5<sup>th</sup> article of my  
will with all the Building also my waggon horses gears & all  
farming utensils I will that John & Absalom pay my son  
David Weare out of the land the sum of fifty dollars to  
his use & behove forever & will that if Absalom should not  
be able to labor or maintain himself that John do provide for  
him & maintain him and Reserve his Absalom's part of the land  
for his recompence

5<sup>th</sup> I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sarah wife of John  
Whittemore the sum of twelve dollars & fifty cents to her use & behove  
forever to be paid out of my Estate

7<sup>th</sup> I give & bequeath unto my daughter Salomey wife of  
Joseph Fisher the sum of twelve dollars & fifty cents to be paid  
out of my Estate to her use & behove for use lastly I appoint  
my son John Weare my Executor of this my last will & Testament  
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this  
eighteenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and  
forty five
