of sound mind and memory, do make and declare
this my last Will and Testament as follows:

I, that my executor hereinafter named, will
shall provide for me a decent burial according to the
wishes of my children.

I will and bequeath to my daughters namely
Mariah and Sophia and my grand son Nath'l.
Bonfield what ever of my brother Henry Waddings
estate which may fall to me by heirs ship or his sister
or by will either real personal or mixed, that
they three share equal in all the above, and all my
house hold and kitchen furniture consisting of
beds and beds, tables, chairs, desks, cupboards
ware hats & wear to my two daughters above named
and appurtenances thereto, my trusty friend Nath'l. L. Bonfield
my executor to all intents and purposes to this my
last Will and Testament having never made any
other signed & sealed in present
