aforesaid heirs Item I will and bequeath to my son James Segman  
the Table and cupboard and black and brown are etc the property in the  
possession to be his where my said son James Segman whosever part dollars  
he is to happen of which amount I give him twenty dollars the balance he is to pay  
into my estate Item I will to my daughter Elizabeth Segman Alice Segman  
& her heirs and my son James Segman his and the balance of my  
Property which is not already settled in manner above Item I am testamony of notes  
and many to be equally divided among them three or four heirs  
that is to say Elizabeth Segman & Martin

Lastly I do hereby command and appaint my two grandsons Jonathan R. Thompson  
my lawful Executor to sell inventories and property to execute this my last will and Testament

61 I George Ward of the County of Lancaster and State of North Carolina  
being of sound mind and disposing, now and memory full understanding,  
the certainty of my earthly existence to make and publish this my last  
Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say  
First that my executors hereinafter named shall provide for my body a  
decent burial suitable to the worth of my relations and friends and  
Pay all of my just debts together with my funeral expenses however & to  
Whomsoever owing and of any money that may come into their hands as a  
part or parcel of my estate  
Also I give and devise to my son Geo A Ward my negro boy named Adams  
also my negro girl named Sally to him and his personal representation  
absolutely for ever. Also I give and devise to my son Anthony Ward the  
Plantation or tract of land wherein I now live and wherein he also lives containing  
one hundred and eighty acres except there small pieces that has been given  
or sold off of said tract of land, one piece to his brother John Ward  
& another to Wm. Wimberly, making in all about fourteen or fifteen acres of said  
tract of land was conveyed to me by Captain Sust. H. Anderson bearing date  
the fourteenth day of September 1816, to him and his personal representation  
in fee simple absolutely forever, I also give to my son Anthony my negro  
man Charles Ward & gray horse Collier Tom, and rifle gun & shot bag  
his choice and my blacksmith tools to be his and let his personal representative  
use. My Threshing machine I allow to remain on my Plantation where it  
now is one half to the use and benefit of my son Geo A and the other  
half to the use of my son Anthony  
Also my will and devise is that a tract of land that I have lying near  
the cabin of Nathan Burkhardt one hundred and twenty five acres except  
about ten or twelve acres which I have leased to Polly Moore during life  
of Anderson, bearing date the 11 day of May 1848, said tract of land  
was conveyed to me by Anthony Ward of Anderson bearing date the 12 day of  
April 1848 and also a tract of land in the Waters of Maden Creek  
containing forty eight acres belonging to me & Captain Sust H. Anderson  
bearing date the 14 day of September 1816. That the above described  
tracts of land together with all the residue of my estate after paying out the  
debts and expenses before mentioned shall be sold and the debts owing  
to my children, and of them should be any bankrupts after having my  
debts and also the debts when I am standing my son Anthony & my  
daughter and legacy that such & proportion shall be equally divided &  
Paid over to all my children as follows to Mr. Anthony Ward & my  
daughter Elizabeth who is indorsed with John Wimberly in equal  
proportion than and than alike to them and each and every of them  
their expenses and administration absolutely free  
And lastly I do truly constitute and appoint my two sons  
Geo A Ward and Anthony Ward my lawful executors to execute

to sustain the Lucy Burns to support him and take good care of him so  
long as he lives

7th It is my will that the residue or remainder of my property无论if any at my
