

## November Session 1867

In the name of God amen, I Michael Huddville of the County of Catawba and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind, but feeling the infirmities of age and knowing that I must part off this Mortality, and appear before my Creator and Judge do make ordain and publish this my last will and testament.

I give and bequeath my spirit unto God, its Father in humble faith on the Lord Jesus assured that he will save it in the day of Resurrection; and my body I recommend to a Christian burial in the earth, hoping for a glorious immortality.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Barbara Eliza eight hundred dollars out of my estate to make her equal with her brother, teaching a sum there-hundred given to him.

I give and devise unto my daughter Barbara Eliza, the house and lot on which she liveth and also give and bequeath unto her all my household, and kitchen furniture of every description, to the value of the eight hundred dollars mentioned above, and for her kindly and attentive service during all my infirmities of age I also give her the contents of my milk house and another house-one acre and two garden plots and my cattle and hogs on hand.

I give and bequeath unto my son Ephraim Huddville twenty dollars, money advanced to me shortly after the late war.

I give and bequeath unto my son Harten Luther Huddville fifty dollars as above stated.

I will and bequeath that the balance of all my estate shall be sold and the money collected by my ~~sons~~ and the friends of the late-and the money arising from the collection of the debt due me shall be equally divided between my sons Ephraim Harten and Melanchthon Huddvilles and my daughter Barbara Eliza Huddville.

I do hereby declare and publish the foregoing to be my last will and testament revoking and abrogating all former wills by me before made and do hereby appoint my son Melanchthon Huddville and Mr. G. A. Corkle executors of this my last will and testament.

## November Session 1867

In the name of God, I Andrew M. Whiteman of the County of Catawba and State of North Carolina, being called to the Perfecto Army, full of perfect memory thanks to give to God, but knowing that all men must die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, That is to say principal and first of all give and bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my body to earth nothing deeming but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again, by the mighty power of God, as touching such things wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give and devise, dispose of the same in the following manner, and from first of all give onto my beloved wife Anna all my lands & chattels and all that may at the time to be hereon provided the like a single life to the end of her days but should she marry after my death she shall have a childer part of the property only. She may have the privilege to sell my plantation lying in Bush County the same containing 170 acres at any time she sees fit to do so but should she live a widow to the end of her days, and die intestate all the property to be divided equally between my sons. I also appoint Eli Whiteman my executor, In witness whereunto I set my hand and seal this the 1st of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven.
